A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to a home and community-based waiver for persons
2 with brain injury.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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S.F. 2297

1 Section 1. HOME AND COMMUNITY-BASED WAIVER -- PERSONS WITH
2 BRAIN INJURY.

3 1. The department of human services shall submit a waiver
4 request to the United States department of health and human
5 services, on or before July 1, 1995, for approval for the
6 redirection of resources for medical assistance services
7 provided to persons with brain injuries, from institutional
8 services to home and community-based services, which would
9 allow persons with brain injuries to remain in or return to
10 the person's home, community, or work force while retaining
11 necessary personal support services.

12 2. Submission of the waiver is contingent upon the deter-
13 mination of the department that replacement of institutional
14 services with home and community-based services would not have
15 adverse fiscal result at the federal and state levels.

16 3. Upon approval by the United States department of health
17 and human services, the department shall implement the waiver
18 on the first day of the month following approval.

19 EXPLANATION

20 This bill directs the department of human services to
21 submit a waiver request to the United States department of
22 health and human services, on or before July 1, 1995, for
23 approval of redirection of resources from institutional
24 services to home and community-based services for persons with
25 brain injury who receive medical assistance, if the department
26 is able to determine that the redirection would not have an
27 adverse fiscal result at the federal and state levels.
28 Following approval, the department is required to implement
29 the waiver on the first day of the month following federal
30 approval.

AN ACT

RELATING TO A HOME AND COMMUNITY-BASED WAIVER FOR PERSONS WITH BRAIN INJURY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. HOME AND COMMUNITY-BASED WAIVER -- PERSONS WITH BRAIN INJURY.

1. The department of human services shall submit a waiver request to the United States department of health and human services, on or before July 1, 1995, for approval for the redirection of resources for medical assistance services provided to persons with brain injuries, from institutional services to home and community-based services, which would allow persons with brain injuries to remain in or return to the person's home, community, or work force while retaining necessary personal support services.

2. Submission of the waiver is contingent upon the determination of the department that replacement of institutional services with home and community-based services would not have adverse fiscal result at the federal and state levels.
