Section 1. Section 358.9, unnumbered paragraphs 1 and 3, 1 2 Code 1993, are amended to read as follows: At the election provided for in section 358.7, the names of 4 candidates for trustee of the district shall be written by the 5 voters on blank ballots without formal nomination, and the 6 board of supervisors which had jurisdiction of the proceedings 7 for establishment of the sanitary district, together with the 8 board of supervisors of any other county in which any part of 9 the district is located, shall appoint three trustees from 10 among the five persons receiving the greatest number of votes ll as trustees of the district. One of the trustees shall be 12 designated to serve a term expiring on the first day of 13 January which is not a Sunday or legal holiday following the 14 next general election, one to serve a term expiring on the 15 first day of January which is not a Sunday or legal holiday 16 two years later, and one to serve a term expiring on the first 17 day of January which is not a Sunday or legal holiday four 18 years later. Thereafter, each term shall be for a term of 19 years established by the board of supervisors, not less than 20 three years or more than six years. Successors to the-initial 21 trustees shall be chosen elected by special election or at a 22 special meeting of the board of trustees called for that 23 purpose. 1 An Act relating to the selection of trustees for water districts
2 and sanitary districts, and providing for retroactive

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 357.13, Code 1993, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 357.13 TRUSTEES -- QUALIFICATION AND TERMS.
- 4 1. At the initial election provided for in section 357.12,
- 5 the names of the trustees shall be written by the voter on
- 6 blank ballots without formal nomination and the board of
- 7 supervisors shall appoint three from among the five receiving
- 8 the highest number of votes as trustees for the district, one
- 9 to serve for one year, one for two years, and one for three
- 10 years. The trustees and their successors shall give bond in
- II the amount the board of supervisors may require, the premium
- 12 of which shall be paid by the district which the trustees
- 13 represent. Vacancies during a term may shall be filled by
- 14 election; or by appointment by the remaining members of the
- 15 board of supervisors, -at-the-option-of-the-remaining trustees
- 16 until a successor is chosen by special election or at an
- 17 annual meeting of the board of trustees called for that
- 18 purpose. Upon petition of a majority of the landowners owning
- 19 more than fifty percent of the total land in the district, the
- 20 board of trustees shall call an annual meeting of the
- 21 residents of the district to elect successors to the trustees
- 22 of the board. The trustees must be residents of the district.
- 23 The term of succeeding trustees shall be for three years.

- 7 2. Sections 1 and 2 of this Act are retroactive to January
- 8 1, 1993, and applicable on and after that date for any
- 9 vacancies occurring on the board of trustees of a water
- 10 district or a sanitary district.
- 11 EXPLANATION
- 12 This bill provides that, after the initial board members
- 13 are selected, members of the board of trustees of water
- 14 districts and sanitary districts are to be selected by a
- 15 special election or at an annual meeting of the board of
- 16 trustees called by a majority of the landowners owning more
- 17 than 50 percent of the total land in the district.
- 18 The selection process is the same for both water districts
- 19 and sanitary districts to provide uniform organizational
- 20 provisions if a joint water and sanitary district is formed.
- 21 The bill is immediately effective and retroactively
- 22 applicable to January 1, 1993, to include the selection of
- 23 trustees for vacancies occurring on or after that date.

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
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AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SELECTION OF TRUSTEES FOR SANITARY DISTRICTS,
AND PROVIDING FOR RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE
DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 358.9, unnumbered paragraphs 1 and 3, Code 1993, are anended to read as follows:

At the election provided for in section 358.7, the names of candidates for trustee of the district shall be written by the voters on blank ballots without formal nomination, and the board of supervisors which had jurisdiction of the proceedings for establishment of the sanitary district, together with the board of supervisors of any other county in which any part of the district is located, shall appoint three trustees from among the five persons receiving the greatest number of votes as trustees of the district. One of the trustees shall be designated to serve a term expiring on the first day of January which is not a Sunday or legal holiday following the next general election, one to serve a term expiring on the first day of January which is not a Sunday or legal holiday two years later, and one to serve a term expiring on the first day of January which is not a Sunday or legal holiday four years later. Thereafter, each term shall be for a term of

years established by the board of supervisors, not less than three years or more than six years. Successors to the initial trustees shall be chosen elected by special election or at a special meeting of the board of trustees called for that purpose. After For each special election called after the initial election, a candidate for office of trustee shall be nominated by a personal affidavit of the candidate or by petition of at least ten eligible electors of the district and the candidate's personal affidavit, which shall be filed with the county commissioner of elections at least twenty-five days before the date of the election. The form of the candidate's affidavit shall be substantially the same as provided in section 45.3.

Howevery-for-districts-formed after-July-17-1984 In lieu of a special election, successors to the initial trustees shall be elected at the next-general election or at an annual a special meeting of the board of trustees called for that purpose. Upon its own motion, the board of trustees may, or upon petition of a-majority-of-the landowners owning more than fifty percent of the total land in the district, the board-of trustees shall, call an-annual a special meeting of the residents of the district to elect successors to trustees of the board. Vacancies-shall-be-filled-by-the-remaining trustees-in-the-same-manner-as-city-council-members-as provided-in-section-372:i37-subsection-2 Notice of the neeting shall be given at least ten days before the date of the meeting by publication of the notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the district. The notice shall state the date, times, and location of the meeting and that the meeting is called for the purpose of electing one or more trustees to the board.

Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE AND RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY DATES.

1. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

2. Section 1 of this Act is retroactive to January 1, 1993, and applicable on and after that date for any vacancies occurring on the board of trustees of a sanitary district.
