1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 322.5A ANTIQUE VEHICLE SALES.
2 A motor vehicle dealer or another person may display
3 antique vehicles at fairs, vehicle shows, and vehicle
4 exhibitions. A motor vehicle dealer or another person may,
5 upon receipt of a temporary permit approved by the department,
6 display and sell antique vehicles only at county fairs, as
7 defined in chapter 174, vehicle shows, and vehicle exhibitions
8 which fairs, shows, and exhibitions are approved by the
9 department for purposes of antique vehicle sales. Application
10 for temporary permits shall be made upon forms provided by the
11 department and shall be accompanied by a ten dollar permit
12 fee. Permits shall be issued for periods of not to exceed
13 five days. A maximum of three permits may be issued to a
14 motor vehicle dealer or person pursuant to this section during
15 a calendar year. The provisions of section 322.3, subsection
16 9, preventing sales on Sunday, are not applicable to this
17 subsection. For purposes of this subsection, "antique
18 vehicle" means a motor vehicle twenty years old or older which
19 is primarily of value as a collector's item and not as
20 transportation.

21 EXPLANATION

22 This bill provides that persons or motor vehicle dealers
23 can display and sell antique vehicles at fairs or exhibitions.
24 The bill defines an antique vehicle as a vehicle 20 years or
25 older valued primarily for its collectibility. The bill
26 authorizes issuance of a temporary permit for purposes of this
27 subsection and permits sales of antique vehicles at fairs or
28 exhibitions on Sundays. A maximum of three permits annually
29 can be issued to any person or dealer and each permit period
30 shall not exceed five days.

30 shall not exceed five days.

Section 1. Section 322.5, subsection 1, Code 1993, is amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph:
NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. For the purposes of this subsection, parcels of property shall be deemed to be adjacent if the parcels are only separated by an alley, street, or highway that is not a controlled-access facility.
