A motor vehicle dealer or another person may, 5 upon receipt of a temporary permit approved by the department, 6 display and sell antique vehicles only at county fairs, as 7 defined in chapter 174, vehicle shows, and vehicle exhibitions 8 which fairs, shows, and exhibitions are approved by the 9 department for purposes of antique vehicle sales. Application 10 for temporary permits shall be made upon forms provided by the Il department and shall be accompanied by a ten dollar permit 12 fee. Permits shall be issued for periods of not to exceed 13 five days. A maximum of three permits may be issued to a 14 motor vehicle dealer or person pursuant to this section during 15 a calendar year.
