2	BY HURLEY, HAMMITT, and GARMAN
3	A Concurrent Resolution urging the required use of
4	reflectorized strips on railroad cars.
5	WHEREAS, safe travel of rail freight and
6	passengers, as well as the motoring public, is a
7	paramount concern of this state; and
8	WHEREAS, Iowa has over 4,000 miles of railroad
9	track in this state as well as a significant number of
10	railroad crossings; and
11	WHEREAS, Iowa motorists have been involved in about
12	115 accidents involving trains and motor vehicles each
13	year, with an average of 12 fatalities each year and
14	18 fatalities during 1994; and
15	WHEREAS, measures to try to improve railroad safety
16	through upgraded railroad crossing devices have always
17	been supported; and
18	WHEREAS, the use of reflectorized strips on
19	railroad cars has been proposed as a measure to try to
20	reduce the number of accidents and fatalities
21	involving trains and motor vehicles by improving the
22	visibility of trains; and
23	WHEREAS, several railroad companies, including the
24	Chicago and Northwestern, Soo Line, and Burlington
25	Northern, have begun to experiment with the use of
26	reflectorized strips on railroad cars; and
27	WHEREAS, the use of reflectorized strips, however,
28	is not currently required by law or regulation; and
29	WHEREAS, regulation of rail transportation is a
30	federal concern with limited ability of states to

- l propose requirements that affect railroads that
- 2 operate in interstate commerce; NOW THEREFORE,
- BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE
- 4 SENATE CONCURRING, That the Iowa General Assembly
- 5 encourage railroads to use reflectorized strips on
- 6 railroad cars in order to improve the safety of
- 7 railroads and motorists.
- 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Iowa congressional
- 9 delegation be urged to support efforts to require the
- 10 use of reflectorized strips on railroad cars through
- ll law or regulation.
- 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this
- 13 resolution be sent to the Governor, the President of
- 14 the United States, the President of the United States
- 15 Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of
- 16 Representatives, members of Iowa's congressional
- 17 delegation, and the Secretary of the United States
- 18 Department of Transportation.
