1 are worthy of protection from desecration and 2 dishonor; and

3 WHEREAS, the American flag is a most honorable and 4 worthy banner that is a symbol of a nation which is 5 thankful for its strengths and is committed to curing 6 its faults, a nation that remains the destination of 7 millions of immigrants attracted by the universal 8 power of the American ideal; and

9 WHEREAS, the Constitution, as interpreted by the 10 United States Supreme Court, no longer accords the 11 Stars and Stripes the reverence, respect, and dignity 12 befitting the banner of this most noble experiment of 13 a nation-state; and

WHEREAS, it is only fitting that people everywhere should lend their voices to a forceful call for restoration of the Stars and Stripes to a proper station under law and decency; NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE SENATE CONCURRING, That the General Assembly of the State of Iowa respectfully requests that the Congress of the United States propose an amendment to the United States Constitution, to be ratified by the states, that specifies that Congress and the states have the power to prohibit the physical desecration of the flag of the United States; and

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this 27 Resolution be transmitted to the Speaker of the United 28 States House of Representatives, the President of the 29 United States Senate, and all of the members of Iowa's 30 congressional delegation.
