2 h, Code 1995, are amended to read as follows:

3 d. The game is posted and the cost to play the game does

6 ~~twenty-five~~ fifty dollars. If a prize consists of more than  
7 one item, unit or part, the aggregate retail value of all  
8 items, units or parts shall not exceed ~~twenty-five~~ fifty  
9 dollars.

10 EXPLANATION

11 This bill increases the maximum cost to play a game of  
12 skill or game of chance at an amusement concession from \$1 to  
13 \$3. The bill also increases the value of the prize which may  
14 be offered for winning a game of skill or game of chance from  
15 \$25 to \$50.

AN ACT

RELATING TO COST OF PLAY AND VALUE OF PRIZES OF GAMES OF SKILL AND GAMES OF CHANCE CONDUCTED AT AMUSEMENT CONCESSIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 99B.3, subsection 1, paragraphs d and h, Code 1995, are amended to read as follows:

d. The game is posted and the cost to play the game does not exceed ~~one-dollar~~ three dollars.

h. The actual retail value of any prize does not exceed twenty-five fifty dollars. If a prize consists of more than one item, unit or part, the aggregate retail value of all
