A BILL FOR

1	An	Act relating to the management of waste tires by providing for						
2		the establishment of a waste tire management grant program,						
3								
4	11	allocation of moneys for the establishment and administration						
		of waste tire management projects, providing for a fee on						
5		certificates of title, and providing for a repeal and an						
6		effective date provision.						
7	BE	IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:						
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1 Section 1. Section 321.52A, Code 1995, is amended to read 2 as follows:

3 321.52A CERTIFICATE OF TITLE SURCHARGE.

4 <u>1.</u> In addition to the fee required for the issuance of a 5 certificate of title under section 321.20, 321.23, 321.42, 6 321.46, 321.47, 321.48, 321.50, or 321.52, a surcharge of five 7 dollars shall be required. Of each surcharge collected under 8 those sections, the county treasurer shall remit five dollars 9 to the office of treasurer of state for deposit in the general 10 fund of the state.

11 2. Notwithstanding subsection 1, beginning July 1, 1995, 12 and ending December 31, 2001, in lieu of the surcharge which 13 would otherwise be required under subsection 1 and in addition 14 to the fee required for the issuance of a certificate of title 15 under section 321.20, 321.23, 321.42, 321.46, 321.47, 321.48, 16 321.50, or 321.52, a surcharge of ten dollars shall be 17 required. Of each surcharge collected under those sections, 18 the county treasurer shall remit five dollars to the office of 19 treasurer of state for deposit in the general fund of the 20 state and shall remit five dollars to the office of the 21 treasurer of state for deposit in the waste tire management 22 fund created in section 455D.11D.

23 Sec. 2. Section 321.52A, subsection 2, as enacted in this 24 Act, is amended by striking the subsection.

25 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 455D.11C WASTE TIRE MANAGEMENT --26 GRANT PROGRAM.

1. Beginning July 1, 1995, and ending December 31, 2001, the waste management assistance division of the department shall establish a waste tire management grant program to promote the safe collection and disposal of waste tires at the local community level. The program shall consist of all of the following:

a. Evaluation and approval or denial of grant applications
34 in accordance with the criteria developed by the division for
35 grants for local waste tire management programs.

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b. Allocation of funds to boards of supervisors of
 2 participating counties or to a designee of each board for
 3 which a grant is approved for use in establishing and
 4 administering local waste tire management programs.

5 c. The provision of technical assistance to local waste 6 tire management programs.

d. Submission of an annual report to the governor and the
8 general assembly based upon a compilation of the annual
9 reports submitted by participating boards of supervisors.
10 2. The division shall establish a grant program for the
11 approval or denial of grant applications submitted by county
12 boards of supervisors which choose to participate in the
13 program.

14 a. Grant moneys shall be provided through allocation of 15 moneys in the waste tire management fund created in section 16 455D.11D and shall be allocated to a participating county in 17 an amount which is one dollar and fifty cents per capita based 18 upon the population of the county as documented in the 1990 19 census.

b. The program shall require that a county submit an
annual application for participation by September 1.
Applications shall be approved or denied, in accordance with
the criteria developed by the division, within thirty days of
receipt and moneys shall be allocated by January 15 of the
subsequent year.

26 c. Moneys shall be allocated to the board of supervisors 27 or the board's designee for which an application has been 28 approved for the establishment and implementation of a local 29 waste tire management program.

30 d. The board of supervisors or the board's designee shall 31 work in cooperation with the city councils of the cities 32 located within the county in developing and implementing the 33 program, and may work with private entities in implementing 34 the program. The boards of supervisors of counties may join 35 together and combine moneys allocated to establish and

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1 implement a program to provide waste tire management services 2 for the populations served by the counties.

3 e. Each county participating in the grant program shall 4 designate a site for the collection of waste tires, which 5 shall accept waste tires without charge.

6 A tire dealer to whom a waste tire collection site is f. 7 accessible through a participating county shall accept at the 8 time of sale of replacement tires, at retail, waste tires in 9 the same amount as the number of replacement tires sold, 10 without charge.

11 q. Each county participating in the grant program is 12 encouraged to promote the local waste tire management program, 13 to encourage nonprofit organization and private entity 14 participation, and to generate local funding for 15 supplementation of the grant moneys awarded. The board of 16 supervisors of a participating county may establish 17 limitations regarding the numbers and types of waste tires 18 collected and the entities from which a site is required to 19 accept waste tires, other than from individuals or tire 20 dealers.

21 h. Each participating county shall submit an annual report 22 to the waste management assistance division of the department 23 which shall include an itemization of expenditures, a report 24 of the volume of waste tires collected, and recommendations 25 for improvement in the grant program and other information 26 requested by the department in the grant application form. 27 Moneys which are not expended but which are encumbered i. 28 at the end of each year may be retained by the county if the 29 county submits an application for continued approval. If a 30 county does not receive continued approval of a local waste 31 tire management program and unexpended and unencumbered moneys 32 remain, the county shall remit the moneys to the treasurer of 33 state for deposit in the waste tire management fund. Moneys 34 which are unexpended and unencumbered on June 30, 2001, shall 35 be remitted to the treasurer of state for deposit in the waste

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1 tire management fund.

2 3. As used for the purposes of the waste tire management 3 grant program, unless the context otherwise requires:

4 a. "Replacement tire" means a new, used, or retreaded tire 5 used to replace a waste tire for use on a vehicle.

6 b. "Tire dealer" means a person who sells replacement7 tires at retail.

8 c. "Waste tire" means a waste tire, as defined in section 9 455D.11, removed from a vehicle which is subject to the 10 certificate of title surcharge imposed pursuant to section 11 321.52A.

12 Sec. 4. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 455D.11D WASTE TIRE MANAGEMENT 13 FUND.

14 1. A waste tire management fund is created within the 15 state treasury. Moneys received from each additional five-16 dollar surcharge on the issuance of a certificate of title 17 pursuant to section 321.52A shall be deposited in the fund. 18 Notwithstanding section 8.33, any unexpended balance in the 19 fund at the end of each fiscal year shall be retained in the 20 fund. Notwithstanding section 12C.7, any interest and 21 earnings on investments from money in the fund shall be 22 credited to the fund. Any unexpended and unencumbered moneys 23 remaining in the fund on December 31, 2001, shall revert to 24 the general fund of the state.

25 2. Moneys in the fund may be used for all of the following 26 purposes:

a. The awarding of grants to county boards of supervisors
or an individual board's designee, which apply for and are
approved for participation in the waste tire management grant
program pursuant to section 455D.11C.

b. Moneys remaining in the fund following allocation of
grants under paragraph "a" may be used by the department for
the management of existing waste tire stockpiles in the state.
c. Not more than five percent of the moneys remaining in
the fund following allocation under paragraphs "a" and "b" may

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1 be used by the department for administrative costs of the 2 waste tire management grant program and for management of 3 existing waste tire stockpiles.

4 Sec. 5. REPEALS -- EFFECTIVE DATE.

5 1. Sections 455D.11C and 455D.11D, as enacted in this Act,6 are repealed effective January 1, 2002.

7 2. Section 2 and this section of this Act take effect 8 January 1, 2002.

EXPLANATION

10 This bill requires the waste management assistance division 11 of the department of natural resources to establish a waste 12 tire management grant program to provide for the awarding of 13 grants to county boards of supervisors or boards' designees to 14 establish and implement a local program for the collection and 15 management of waste tires. The bill provides requirements for 16 participation in the program, establishes a source of funding 17 through an increased surcharge on certificates of title and 18 for allocation of moneys from the waste tire management fund, 19 created in the bill, for grants, management of existing waste 20 tire stockpiles, and administrative costs. The bill also 21 provides for a repeal of the program and fund on December 31, 22 2001.

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
