2 Supplement 1995, is amended to read as follows:

3 Notwithstanding other provisions of this section, rules  
4 adopted under this section concerning physical and medical

16 drivers of commercial vehicles engaged in intrastate commerce

AN ACT

EXTENDING AN EXEMPTION FROM FEDERAL MOTOR CARRIER SAFETY REGULATIONS FOR MEDICALLY UNQUALIFIED DRIVERS AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 321.449, unnumbered paragraph 5, Code Supplement 1995, is amended to read as follows:

Notwithstanding other provisions of this section, rules adopted under this section concerning physical and medical qualifications for drivers of commercial vehicles engaged in intrastate commerce shall not be construed as disqualifying any individual who was employed as a driver of commercial vehicles engaged in intrastate commerce whose physical or medical condition existed prior to ~~January 17, 1988~~ July 29, 1996.
