The governor shall appoint from each of the organizations one representative to serve as a member of the commission, unless the appointments would conflict with the bipartisan and gender

balance provisions of sections 69.16 and 69.16A. In addition, the governor shall appoint two-members one member of the public, knowledgeable in the general field of veterans affairs, to serve on the commission.

- Sec. 3. Section 35A.3, Code 1995, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

- 2. Study the costs of training provided to executive directors of county commissions of veteran affairs under subsection 12. The commission shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the general assembly by January 1, 1996.

Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
