1 Section 1. Section 728.11, Code 1995, is amended to read 2 as follows:

3 728.11 UNIFORM APPLICATION -- EXCEPTIONS.

In order to provide for the uniform application of the 4 5 provisions of this chapter relating to obscene material 6 applicable to minors within this state, it is intended that 7 the sole and only regulation of obscene material shall be 8 under the provisions of this chapter, and no-municipality a 9 city, county, or other governmental unit within this state 10 shall not make any law, ordinance, or regulation relating to 11 the availability of obscene materials. All such laws, 12 ordinances, or regulations shall be or become void, 13 unenforceable and of no effect on January 1, 1978.
