1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of
2 the state to the department of natural resources for the
3 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1996, and ending June 30, 1997,
4 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to
5 be used for the purpose designated:

6 For statewide forestry and rural development through
7 forestry projects in cooperation with resource, conservation,
8 and development areas, as authorized under the Food and
9 Agriculture Act of 1962, 16 U.S.C. § 3451-3461, and
10 reauthorized under the Food, Agriculture, Conservation, and
11 Trade Act of 1990, 16 U.S.C. § 3459-3461, and to administer
12 the program in cooperation with the United States department
13 of agriculture's natural resources conservation service:

15 EXPLANATION

16 The 1990 federal farm bill established the rural
17 development through forestry (RDTF) program, 7 U.S.C. § 6601-
18 6617. The program is administered by the United States
19 department of agriculture's natural resources conservation
20 service and implemented through state forestry agencies. Iowa
21 was designated as a pilot state under the federal RDTF
22 program.

23 Rural development through forestry, as administered by the
24 department of natural resources, provides matching grants to
25 local entities for developing forest resources based on
26 economic development. In the state of Iowa's pilot program,
27 local projects were identified and carried out primarily
28 through nine resource, conservation, and development (RC&D)
29 areas.

30 RC&D areas are private, not-for-profit corporations that
31 are organized pursuant to chapter 504A of the Code of Iowa.
32 RC&D areas are locally governed by volunteer directors with
33 required representation by the county boards of supervisors,
34 the local soil and water conservation districts, and local
35 people interested in the program. The purpose of RC&D areas

1 is job creation through value-added wood utilization projects.
2 RC&D areas were authorized under the Food and Agriculture Act
3 of 1962, 16 U.S.C. § 3451-3461, and reauthorized under the
4 Food, Agriculture, Conservation, and Trade Act of 1990, 16
5 U.S.C. § 3459-3461.

6 This bill appropriates \$1,000,000 from the general fund of
7 the state to the department of natural resources for the
8 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1996, and ending June 30, 1997,
9 for statewide forestry and rural development through forestry
10 projects in cooperation with RC&D areas and to administer the
11 program in cooperation with the United States department of
12 agriculture's natural resources conservation service.
