EXPLANATION

This bill provides an exception to human immunodeficiency virus-related (HIV-related) testing requirements including preliminary and post-test counseling, when the subject of the test is deceased, a significant exposure has occurred, the deceased person has a legal guardian who consents to the test, or the deceased person does not have a legal guardian and a spouse, parent, or member of the deceased person's family responsible for the handling of the body provides consent to 22 the test.

33 The bill also provides that the results of an HIV-related 34 test and the identity of the subject of the test may be 35 disclosed to the person who secures a release of the test

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1 results from a person authorized to provide consent under the 2 provision relating to the testing of a deceased person.

Remedies for violation of provisions relating to HIV-4 related testing, including the right of action for damages, is 5 applicable to a violation of the new provisions.
