A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to increasing the hourly minimum wage requirement 2 in Iowa.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 91D.1, subsection 1, paragraphs a and 2 d, Code 1995, are amended to read as follows:
3 a. The hourly wage stated in the federal minimum wage law, 4 pursuant to 29 U.S.C. $\$ 206$, shall be increased to $\$ 3.85 \$ 5.00$

## EXPLANATION

This bill increases the hourly minimum wage requirement for employees with 90 calendar days of employment with the employer to $\$ 5$ on July $1,1996, \$ 5.50$ on January 1,1997 , and $\$ 6$ on July l, 1997. Those with fewer than 90 calendar days of employment by those dates shall earn a minimum wage of $\$ 4.85$, $\$ 5$, and $\$ 5.50$, respectively.
