1 Section 1. Section 357A.14, subsection 1, Code 1995, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 1. An owner of real property outside a district which can
4 be economically served by the facilities of the district, or
5 thirty percent of the owners of all real property lying within
6 the outside perimeter of a proposed addition, may petition to
7 be attached to the district. The petition shall be filed with
8 the auditor, and the auditor and supervisors shall notify the
9 district that a petition has been received and proceed in a
10 manner set forth in sections 357A.3 through 357A.6.

11 EXPLANATION

12 This bill provides that 30 percent of the owners of land
13 within a proposed addition to a rural water district may
14 petition the board of supervisors to attach all of the real
15 property in the proposed addition to the district. The board
16 of supervisors will approve or disapprove the petition after
17 notice and a public hearing for the public and the affected
18 property owners and tenants.

RELATING TO THE ATTACHMENT OF PROPERTY TO A RURAL WATER DISTRICT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 357A.14, subsection 1, Code 1995, is amended to read as follows:

1. An owner of real property outside a district which can be economically served by the facilities of the district, or thirty percent of the owners of all real property lying within the outside perimeter of a proposed addition, may petition to be attached to the district. The petition shall be filed with
