A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to child abuse and child sexual abuse reporting 2 and referral requirements and increasing a penalty. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 232.69, subsection 1, unnumbered
- 2 paragraph 1, Code 1995, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 The following classes of persons shall make a report within
- 4 twenty-four hours and as provided in section 232.70, of cases
- 5 of child abuse. In addition, the classes of persons shall
- 6 make a report of abuse of a child who is under twelve years of
- 7 age and may make a report of abuse of a child who is twelve
- 8 years of age or older, which would be defined as child abuse
- 9 under section 232.68, subsection 2, paragraph "c" or "e",
- 10 except that the abuse resulted from the acts or omissions of a
- ll person other than a person responsible for the care of the
- 12 child:
- 13 Sec. 2. Section 232.71, Code Supplement 1995, is amended
- 14 by adding the following new subsection:
- 15 NEW SUBSECTION. 1A. If a report would be determined to
- 16 constitute an allegation of child abuse as defined under
- 17 section 232.68, subsection 2, paragraph "c" or "e", except
- 18 that the suspected abuse resulted from the acts or omissions
- 19 of a person other than a person responsible for the care of
- 20 the child, the department shall refer the report to the
- 21 appropriate law enforcement agency having jurisdiction to
- 22 investigate the allegation. The department shall refer the
- 23 report orally as soon as practicable and in writing within
- 24 seventy-two hours of receiving the report.
- 25 Sec. 3. Section 232.75, subsection 1, Code 1995, is
- 26 amended to read as follows:
- 27 1. Any A person, official, agency, or institution,
- 28 required by this chapter to report a suspected case-of child
- 29 abuse or suspected abuse of a child who is under twelve years
- 30 of age which would be defined as child abuse under section
- 31 232.68, subsection 2, paragraph "c" or "e", except that the
- 32 abuse resulted from the acts or omissions of a person other
- 33 than a person responsible for the care of the child, who
- 34 knowingly and willfully fails to do so is-guilty-of commits a
- 35 simple serious misdemeanor.

EXPLANATION

2 This bill relates to child abuse provisions and increases a 3 penalty.

4 Section 232.69 is amended to require mandatory reporters of

5 child abuse to also report sexual abuse of a child who is

6 under 12 years which would be defined as child abuse except

7 that the abuse resulted from acts or omissions of a person

8 other than a person responsible for the care of the child.

9 The bill also authorizes a mandatory reporter to report sexual

10 abuse by this type of perpetrator of a child who is 12 years

11 of age or older. Under current law, a finding of child abuse

12 requires that the abuse results from the acts or omissions of

13 a "person responsible for the care of a child," which is a

14 defined term. The term includes a parent, guardian, foster

15 parent, child care provider, or other person who assumes care

16 or supervision of a child. The sexual abuse required to be

17 reported under the bill includes sexual abuse under chapter

18 709, incest, involvement in prostitution, or sexual

19 exploitation of a minor.

20 Section 232.71 is amended to require the department of

21 human services to refer reports of sexual abuse of a child

22 which result from the acts or omissions of a person other than

23 a person responsible for the care of a child to an appropriate

24 law enforcement agency. The referral must be made orally as

25 soon as practicable and in writing within 72 hours of

26 receiving the report.

27 Section 232.75 is amended to increase the penalty for a

28 mandatory reporter of child abuse who knowingly and willfully

29 does not report a suspected case of child abuse. The

30 reporting requirement is expanded to include the sexual abuse

31 reporting required by the bill. The penalty is increased from

32 a simple to a serious misdemeanor.
