## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to gambling by restricting gambling advertising,
2 by limiting the amount of checks for gambling, by promoting 3 gambling prevention programs, and by providing for other 4 properly related matters.
5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 6

1 Section 1. Section 99E.9, subsection 3, paragraph j, Code 2 Supplement 1995, is amended to read as follows:
3 j. The method to be used in printing and selling tickets
4 or shares. An elected official's name shall not be printed on
5 the tickets. The toll-free telephone number used by the
6 department of human services for its gamblers assistance
7 program shall be printed on the tickets or shares. The
8 overall estimated odds of winning a prize in a given game
9 shall be printed on each ticket if the games have either
10 preprinted winners or fixed odds. Estimated odds of winning a
ll prize are not required to be printed on tickets in lottery
12 games of a pari-mutuel nature. As used in this paragraph,
13 "games of a pari-mutuel nature" means a game in which the
14 amount of the winnings and the odds of winning are determined
15 by the number of participants in the game.
16 Sec. 2. Section 99E.l0, subsection 1 , paragraph a, Code 17 1995, is amended to read as follows:
18 a. An amount equal to three-tenths of one percent of the
19 gross lottery revenue shall be deposited in a gamblers
20 assistance fund in the office of the treasurer of state. The
21 director of human services shall administer the fund and shall
22 provide that receipts are allocated on a monthly basis to
23 provide programs which may include, but are not limited to,
24 outpatient and follow-up treatment for persons affected by
25 problem gambling, treatment for spouses and children of
26 problem gamblers, employer education for identification and
27 referral of problem gamblers, rehabilitation and residential
28 treatment programs, information and referral services, and
29 education and preventive services. The educational,
30 advertising, and informational material and services shall
31 include focuses on prevention of problem gambling and on assisting spouses and children of problem gamblers.

Sec. 3. Section 99E.10, subsection l, unnumbered paragraph
34 2, Code 1995, is amended to read as follows:
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Lottery expenses for marketing, educational, and

1 informational material shall not exceed four-pereent the 2 amount of the gross lottery revenue contributed to the 3 gamblers assistance fund as provided in paragraph "a". 4 Sec. 4. Section 99E.l6, subsection 2, Code 1995, is 5 amended to read as follows:

6 2. A licensee shall sell tickets or shares only on the 7 premises stated in the license. Except for the lottery 8 division, the licensee shall only sell a ticket or share in 9 person and not over a telephone or through the mail. However, 10 the lottery division may sell lottery tickets or shares over 11 the telephone or through the mail. The licensee may accept 12 payment by cash, check, money order, debit card, or electronic 13 funds transfer. A licensee shall not accept one or more 14 checks totaling more than five hundred dollars from one person 15 during a twenty-four-hour period to purchase tickets or shares. The licensee shall not extend or arrange credit for the purchase of a ticket or share. As used in this subsection "cash" means United States currency.

Sec. 5. Section 99F.9, subsection 6, Code 1995, is amended to read as follows:
6. A licensee shall not accept a credit card as defined in 22 section 537.1301 , subsection 16 , to purchase coins, tokens, or 23 other forms of credit to be wagered on gambling games. $\underline{A}^{\mathbf{A}}$ 24 licensee shall not accept one or more checks totaling more than five hundred dollars from one person during a twenty-four-hour period to be wagered on gambling games.

## EXPLANATION

This bill includes proposals to reduce the amount of advertising to promote gambling, and increase programs and advertising to assist problem gamblers and their families. 31 The bill provides that the toll-free telephone number used by 32 the department of human services to assist problem gamblers be 33 printed on all lottery tickets and shares. The bill limits 34 the total amount of checks accepted by a licensee for lottery 35 and gambling games to $\$ 500$ per 24 -hour period.

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The bill also limits the amount of money spent by the state 2 lottery for information, education, and marketing to the same 3 amount that is allocated to the gamblers assistance fund. 4 The bill also provides that the department of human 5 services focus advertising and public information on 6 prevention of problem gambling and assisting spouses and 7 children of problem gamblers to cope with the gambling 8 problem. The bill calls for expanding programs to employer 9 education to identify and refer problem gamblers. 10

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
