A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to school finance, by providing a supplementary weighting formula for gifted and talented children programs, and providing an applicability date. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 257.11, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code
- 2 Supplement 1995, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 In order to provide additional funds for school districts
- 4 which send their resident pupils to another school district or
- 5 to a community college for classes, which jointly employ and
- 6 share the services of teachers under section 280.15, which use
- 7 the services of a teacher employed by another school district,
- 8 or which jointly employ and share the services of a school
- 9 superintendent under section 280.15 or 273.7A, or which have
- 10 established gifted and talented children programs, a
- 11 supplementary weighting plan for determining enrollment is
- 12 adopted as follows:
- 13 Sec. 2. Section 257.11, Code Supplement 1995, is amended
- 14 by adding the following new subsection:
- 15 NEW SUBSECTION. 8. GIFTED AND TALENTED CHILDREN PROGRAMS.
- 16 School districts that have established gifted and talented
- 17 children programs approved pursuant to sections 257.42 through
- 18 257.49 may receive supplementary weighting for each pupil
- 19 enrolled in the program equal to two-tenths. However, the
- 20 total additional weighting allowed under this subsection for a
- 21 budget year for a school district shall not result in
- 22 additional funding in excess of the lesser of the product of
- 23 one-fifth of the district cost per pupil multiplied by one-
- 24 twentieth of the budget enrollment, or of the amount
- 25 established by the department of management, as required in
- 26 section 257.46, to be raised from supplementary weighting.
- Sec. 3. Section 257.42, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 1995,
- 28 is amended to read as follows:
- 29 Boards of school districts, individually or jointly with
- 30 the boards of other school districts, requesting to use
- 31 additional-allowable-growth receive supplementary weighting
- 32 for gifted and talented children programs, may annually submit
- 33 program plans for gifted and talented children programs and
- 34 budget costs, including requests for additional-allowable
- 35 growth supplementary weighting for funding the programs, to

- 1 the department of education and to the applicable gifted and
- 2 talented children advisory council, if an advisory council has
- 3 been established, as provided in this chapter.
- 4 Sec. 4. Section 257.42, unnumbered paragraphs 4 and 5,
- 5 Code 1995, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 The department of education shall adopt rules under chapter
- 7 17A relating to the administration of sections 257.42 through
- 8 257.49. The rules shall prescribe the format of program plans
- 9 submitted under section 257.43 and shall require that programs
- 10 fulfill specified objectives. The department shall encourage
- 11 and assist school districts to provide programs for gifted and
- 12 talented children whether or not additional-allowable-growth
- 13 supplementary weighting is requested under this chapter.
- 14 The department may request that the staff of the auditor of
- 15 state conduct an independent program audit to verify that the
- 16 gifted and talented children programs funded by additional
- 17 allowable-growth supplementary weighting conform to a
- 18 district's program plans.
- 19 Sec. 5. Section 257.45, subsection 1, Code 1995, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 1. The board of directors of a school district requesting
- 22 to use-additional-allowable-growth receive supplementary
- 23 weighting for gifted and talented children programs shall
- 24 submit applications for approval for the programs to the
- 25 department not later than November 1 preceding the fiscal year
- 26 during which the program will be offered. The board shall
- 27 also submit a copy of the program plans to the gifted and
- 28 talented children advisory council, if an advisory council has
- 29 been established. The department shall review the program
- 30 plans and shall prior to January 15 either grant approval for
- 31 the program or return the request for approval with comments
- 32 of the department included. Any unapproved request for a
- 33 program may be resubmitted with modifications to the
- 34 department not later than a date established by the
- 35 department. Not later than February 15 the department shall

- 1 notify the department of management and the school budget
- 2 review committee of the names of the school districts for
- 3 which gifted and talented children programs using-additional
- 4 allowable-growth receiving supplementary weighting for funding
- 5 have been approved and the approved budget of each program
- 6 listed separately for each school district having an approved
- 7 program.
- 8 Sec. 6. Section 257.46, Code 1995, is amended to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 257.46 FUNDING.
- 11 The budget of an approved gifted and talented children
- 12 program for a school district, after subtracting funds
- 13 received from other sources for that purpose, shall be funded
- 14 annually on a basis of one-fourth or more from the district
- 15 cost of the school district and up to three-fourths by an
- 16 increase-in-allowable-growth-as-defined-in-section-257-8
- 17 receipt of supplementary weighting, subject to the funding
- 18 limitations in section 257.11, subsection 8, and this section.
- 19 The approved budget for a gifted and talented children program
- 20 shall not exceed an amount equal to one and twenty-four-
- 21 hundredths percent of the district cost per pupil of the
- 22 district for the base year multiplied by the budget enrollment
- 23 of the district for the budget year. Annually, the department
- 24 of management shall establish a-modified-allowable-growth the
- 25 amount of additional funding needed to be raised from the
- 26 supplementary weighting for each such district equal to the
- 27 difference between the approved budget for the gifted and
- 28 talented children program for that district and the sum of the
- 29 amount funded from the district cost of the school district
- 30 plus funds received from other sources.
- 31 If any portion of the gifted and talented program budget
- 32 remains unexpended at the end of the budget year, the part of
- 33 the remainder equal to the proportion of the original budget
- 34 which was funded by an-increase-in-allowable-growth; -as
- 35 defined-in-section-257-8 supplementary weightings, shall be

1 carried over to the subsequent budget year and added to the 2 gifted and talented program budget for that year. This Act applies to school budget years commencing 4 on or after July 1, 1997. EXPLANATION 6 Present law provides for school districts to receive 7 additional allowable growth to help in funding their gifted 8 and talented children programs. This bill substitutes the 9 allowable growth with supplementary weightings equal to two-10 tenths of a pupil for each pupil enrolled in the gifted and 11 talented program. The maximum amount of additional funds that 12 may be raised from the supplementary weightings equals the 13 lesser of 20 percent of the district cost per pupil times 5 14 percent of budget enrollment or the amount needed to fund the 15 gifted and talented program. 16 The bill applies to school budget years commencing on or 17 after July 1, 1997. 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33

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
