1 Section 1. Section 535.3, Code 1995, is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 535.3 INTEREST ON JUDGMENTS AND DECREES.

4 1. Interest shall be allowed on all money due on judgments 5 and decrees of courts at the rate of-ten-percent-per-year 6 equal to the coupon issue yield equivalent, as determined by 7 the United States secretary of the treasury, of the average 8 accepted auction price for the last auction of fifty-two week 9 United States treasury bills settled immediately prior to the 10 date of the judgment, unless a different rate is fixed by the 11 contract on which the judgment or decree is rendered, in which 12 case the judgment or decree shall draw interest at the rate 13 expressed in the contract, not exceeding the maximum 14 applicable rate permitted by the provisions of section 535.2, 15 which rate must be expressed in the judgment or decree. The 16 interest shall accrue from the date of the commencement-of-the 17 action judgment entry or decree. 18 This-section-does-not-apply-to-the-award-of-interest-for 19 judgments-and-decrees-subject-to-section-668-13-20 2. The state court administrator shall distribute notice 21 monthly of the rate established in subsection 1 and any 22 changes to that rate to all district courts. 23 EXPLANATION 24 This bill provides that the rate of interest on court 25 judgments or decrees, currently fixed at 10 percent, shall be 26 a floating amount based on the coupon issue yield equivalent 27 of the average accepted auction price for the 52 week United 28 States treasury bills. The state court administrator is 29 responsible for providing this information to the district

30 courts. The bill also provides that interest accrues from the 31 date of the judgment or decree instead of from the date of 32 commencement of the action.
