EXPLANATION

12 This bill removes a requirement that state agencies, 13 including the state board of regents, purchase a minimum 14 percentage of starch-based garbage can liners and instead 15 requires that by July 1, 1995, a minimum of 10 percent of the 16 purchases of garbage can liners shall be plastic garbage can 17 liners with recycled content. The percentage required to be 18 purchased increases by 10 percent annually until 50 percent of 19 the purchases of garbage can liners are plastic garbage can 20 liners with recycled content. The bill defines "recycled 21 content" to mean that a minimum of 30 percent of the content 22 of the product consists of postconsumer material. The bill 23 amends provisions which direct the department of general 24 services, the department for the blind, the state board of 25 regents, and the state department of transportation to comply 26 with the directive.

EXPLANATION

12 This bill removes a requirement that state agencies, 13 including the state board of regents, purchase a minimum 14 percentage of starch-based garbage can liners and instead 15 requires that by July 1, 1995, a minimum of 10 percent of the 16 purchases of garbage can liners shall be plastic garbage can 17 liners with recycled content. The percentage required to be 18 purchased increases by 10 percent annually until 50 percent of 19 the purchases of garbage can liners are plastic garbage can 20 liners with recycled content. The bill defines "recycled 21 content" to mean that a minimum of 30 percent of the content 22 of the product consists of postconsumer material. The bill 23 amends provisions which direct the department of general 24 services, the department for the blind, the state board of 25 regents, and the state department of transportation to comply 26 with the directive.

BACKGROUND STATEMENT SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY

The mandate to buy starch-based plastics was introduced as 29 30 a measure to promote the use of starch-based plastics and 31 generate another value-added market for corn. In particular, 32 starch-based garbage bags were to be purchased by the state to 33 help create a market for the product. Since then, Iowa is the 34 only state that sets goals for procurement of starch-based 35 plastic garbage can liners. State agencies are forced to pay

a premium for these bags and must purchase a large minimum
 order in order to comply with the law. Continued purchases
 cannot be justified on economic or environmental grounds.
 Recycled content has become a very common feature of products,
 however, and given the need for markets for such products in
 order to support the efforts to collect more recyclables, it
 makes sense to require their use.
