6 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE -- APPLICABILITY. This Act takes
7 effect December 15, 1995, and applies to all hunting and
8 fishing combined licenses sold for the 1996 license year and

10 EXPLANATION

11 This bill reduces the fee for the resident hunting and
12 fishing combined license from \$23.50 to \$23.00. The \$23.00
13 fee equals the two fees for purchasing the resident fishing
14 license and resident hunting license separately, \$10.50 and
15 \$12.50. This bill takes effect December 15, 1995, and applies
16 to the 1996 license year and subsequent years.

FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for House File 30 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 30 reduces the fee for a combination hunting and fishing license from \$23.50 to \$23.00.

Background:

With the passage of the general hunting and fishing license increase by the 1991 General Assembly, the cost of a combination license for the first time exceeded the cost of separate licenses. Since that time, the number of combination licenses sold has decreased, while the number of separate licenses has increased. Each license fee contains a \$0.50 writing fee. If the Department of Natural Resources sells the license, the Department retains the fee. If the license is sold by a county, the county retains the fee. If the license is sold by a retailer, the retailer retains \$0.25 and the county retains \$0.25. Since the change in fees, combination license sales have decreased by 27,000.

Fiscal Impact:

Assuming combination license sales remain at 54,000, the fee reduction would reduce Fish and Game Fund revenues by \$27,000.

RELATING TO THE FEE FOR A COMBINED HUNTING AND FISHING LICENSE
AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND APPLICABILITY PROVISION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 483A.1, subsection 3, Code 1995, is amended to read as follows:
