A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to snowmobiles by requiring certificates of title, providing for point of sale registration, and increasing snowmobile registration fees. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: HF 357

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DIVISION I

SNOWMOBILE CERTIFICATES OF TITLE

3 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 321G.29 OWNER'S CERTIFICATE OF 4 TITLE -- IN GENERAL.

5 1. The owner of a snowmobile shall apply to the county 6 recorder of the county in which the owner resides for a 7 certificate of title for the snowmobile.

2. Each certificate of title shall contain the information 8 9 and shall be issued in a form the department prescribes. 10 3. Every owner of a snowmobile shall apply to the county 11 recorder for issuance of a certificate of title within thirty 12 days after acquisition. The application shall be on forms the 13 department prescribes and accompanied by the required fee. 14 The application shall be signed and sworn to before a notary 15 public or other person who administers oaths, or shall include 16 a certification signed in writing containing substantially the 17 representation that statements made are true and correct to 18 the best of the applicant's knowledge, information, and 19 belief, under penalty of perjury. The application shall 20 contain the date of sale and gross price of the snowmobile or 21 the fair market value if no sale immediately preceded the 22 transfer and any additional information the department 23 requires. If the application is made for a snowmobile last 24 previously registered or titled in another state or foreign 25 country, the application shall contain this information and 26 any other information the department requires.

4. If a dealer buys or acquires a snowmobile for resale, the dealer shall apply for and obtain a certificate of title as provided in this chapter. If a dealer buys or acquires a used snowmobile, the dealer shall apply for a certificate of title in the dealer's name within fifteen days. If a dealer buys or acquires a new snowmobile for resale, the dealer may apply for a certificate of title in the dealer's name.
5. Every dealer transferring a snowmobile under this

35 chapter shall assign the title to the new owner, or in the

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1 case of a new snowmobile, assign the certificate of origin. 2 Within fifteen days the dealer shall forward all moneys and 3 applications to the county recorder.

6. The county recorder shall maintain a record of any 5 certificate of title which the county recorder issues and 6 shall keep each certificate of title on record until the 7 certificate of title has been inactive for five years.

8 7. A person shall not sell, assign, or transfer a 9 snowmobile without delivering to the purchaser or transferee a 10 certificate of title with an assignment on it showing title in 11 the purchaser or transferee. A person shall not purchase or 12 otherwise acquire a snowmobile without obtaining a certificate 13 of title for it in that person's name.

14 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 321G.30 FEES -- SURCHARGE --15 DUPLICATES.

16 1. The county recorder shall charge a five dollar fee to
 17 issue a certificate of title, a transfer of title, a
 18 duplicate, or a corrected certificate of title.

19 2. If a certificate of title is lost, stolen, mutilated, 20 destroyed, or becomes illegible, the first lienholder or, if 21 there is none, the owner named in the certificate, as shown by 22 the county recorder's records, shall within thirty days obtain 23 a duplicate by applying to the county recorder. The applicant 24 shall furnish information the department requires concerning 25 the original certificate and the circumstances of its loss, 26 mutilation, or destruction. Mutilated or illegible 27 certificates shall be returned to the department with the 28 application for a duplicate.

3. The duplicate certificate of title shall be marked 30 plainly "duplicate" across its face and mailed or delivered to 31 the applicant.

32 4. If a lost or stolen original certificate of title for 33 which a duplicate has been issued is recovered, the original 34 shall be surrendered promptly to the department for 35 cancellation.



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1 5. The certificate of title fees collected under this 2 section shall be remitted by the county recorder to the 3 treasurer of state for deposit in the special conservation 4 fund created under section 321G.7.

5 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 321G.31 TRANSFER OR REPOSSESSION OF 6 SNOWMOBILE BY OPERATION OF LAW.

If ownership of a snowmobile is transferred by
 operation of law, such as by inheritance, order in bankruptcy,
 insolvency, replevin, or execution sale, the transferee,
 within thirty days after acquiring the right to possession of
 the snowmobile, shall mail or deliver to the county recorder
 satisfactory proof of ownership as the county recorder
 requires, together with an application for a new certificate
 of title, and the required fee.

15 2. If a lienholder repossesses a snowmobile by operation
16 of law and holds it for resale, the lienholder shall secure a
17 new certificate of title and shall pay the required fee.
18 Sec. 4. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 321G.32 SECURITY INTEREST --

19 PERFECTION AND TITLES -- FEE.

20 1. A security interest created in this state in a 21 snowmobile is not perfected until the security interest is 22 noted on the certificate of title.

a. To perfect the security interest, an application for
24 security interest must be presented along with the original
25 title. The county recorder shall note the security interest
26 on the face of the title and on the copy in the recorder's
27 office.

28 b. The application fee for a security interest is five
29 dollars. The fee shall be credited to the special
30 conservation fund created under section 321G.7.

31 2. The certificate of title shall be presented to the 32 county recorder when the application for security interest or 33 for assignment of the security interest is presented and a new 34 or endorsed certificate of title shall be issued to the 35 secured party with the name and address of the secured party

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The secured party shall present the certificate of 2 3. 3 title to the county recorder when a release statement is filed 4 and a new or endorsed certificate shall be issued to the 5 owner.

DIVISION II

POINT OF SALE REGISTRATION

8 Sec. 5. Section 321G.15, Code 1995, is amended to read as 9 follows:

10 321G.15 OPERATION PENDING REGISTRATION.

The commission shall furnish snowmobile and all-terrain 11 12 vehicle dealers with pasteboard cards bearing the words 13 "registration applied for" and space for the date of purchase. 14 An unregistered all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile sold by a 15 dealer shall bear one of these cards which entitles the 16 purchaser to operate it for ten days immediately following the The purchaser of a registered all-terrain vehicle 17 purchase. 18 or snowmobile may operate it for ten days immediately 19 following the purchase, without having completed a transfer of 20 registration. A person who purchases an all-terrain vehicle 21 or-snowmobile from a dealer shall, within five days of the 22 purchase, apply for an all-terrain vehicle or-snowmobile 23 registration or transfer of registration. A snowmobile dealer 24 shall make application and pay all registration fees on behalf

25 of the purchaser of a snowmobile. DIVISION III SNOWMOBILE REGISTRATION FEES Sec. 6. Section 321G.6, unnumbered paragraphs 1 and 2,

29 Code 1995, are amended to read as follows:

30 Every all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile registration 31 certificate and number issued expires at midnight December 31, 32 and renewals expire every two years thereafter unless sooner 33 terminated or discontinued in accordance with this chapter. 34 After the first day of September each even-numbered year, an 35 unregistered all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile and renewals

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1 may be registered for the subsequent biennium beginning 2 January 1. An all-terrain vehicle or-snowmobile registered 3 between January 1 and September 1 of even-numbered years shall 4 be registered for a fee of ten dollars for the remainder of 5 the registration period. <u>A snowmobile registered between</u> 6 January 1 and September 1 of even-numbered years shall be 7 registered for a fee of twelve dollars and fifty cents for the 8 remainder of the registration period.

After the first day of September in even-numbered years an 9 10 unregistered all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile may be 11 registered for the remainder of the current registration 12 period and for the subsequent registration period in one 13 transaction. The fee shall be five dollars for the remainder 14 of the current period, in addition to the registration fee of 15 twenty dollars for an all-terrain vehicle and twenty-five 16 dollars for a snowmobile for the subsequent biennium beginning 17 January 1, and a writing fee. Registration certificates and 18 numbers may be renewed upon application of the owner in the 19 same manner as provided in securing the original registration. 20 The all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile registration fee is in 21 lieu of personal property tax for each year of the 22 registration.

EXPLANATION

Division I of the bill requires that snowmobiles have certificates of title. The certificate of title will be issued by a county recorder for a \$5 fee. The fee is to be deposited in the special conservation fund administered by the department of natural resources to be used for state snowmobile programs.

30 Division II requires the snowmobile dealer to complete the 31 application for registration and pay the registration fees on 32 behalf of the purchaser.

33 Division III increases the snowmobile registration fee from 34 \$20 to \$25 for each biennium and from \$10 to \$12.50 for less 35 than a year.

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
