1 2	An	Act relating to the reestablishment of the long-term care resident's advocate program in the office of the citizens'
3		aide, and providing effective dates.
4	BE	IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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- 1 Section 1. Section 2C.1, Code 1995, is amended by adding
- 2 the following new subsections:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 2A. "Elder" means an individual who is
- 4 sixty years of age or older. "Elderly" means individuals
- 5 sixty years of age or older.
- 6 NEW SUBSECTION. 3A. "Federal Act" means the Older
- 7 Americans Act of 1965, 42 U.S.C. § 3001 et seq., as amended to
- 8 and including February 1, 1986.
- 9 NEW SUBSECTION. 3B. "Long-term care facility" means a
- 10 long-term care unit of a hospital, a licensed hospice program,
- 11 a foster group home, a group living arrangement, or a facility
- 12 licensed under section 135C.1 whether the facility is public
- 13 or private.
- 14 NEW SUBSECTION. 6. "Resident's advocate program" means
- 15 the state long-term care resident's advocate program
- 16 established by the office of the citizens' aide and
- 17 administered by the long-term care resident's advocate.
- 18 Sec. 2. Section 2C.6, Code 1995, is amended to read as
- 19 follows:
- 20 2C.6 DEPUTY -- ASSISTANT FOR PENAL AGENCIES -- LONG-TERM
- 21 CARE RESIDENT'S ADVOCATE.
- The citizens' aide shall designate one of the members of
- 23 the staff as the deputy citizens' aide, with authority to act
- 24 as citizens' aide when the citizens' aide is absent from the
- 25 state or becomes disabled. The citizens' aide may delegate to
- 26 members of the staff any of the citizens' aide's authority or
- 27 duties except the duty of formally making recommendations to
- 28 agencies or reports to the governor or the general assembly.
- 29 The citizens' aide shall appoint an assistant who shall be
- 30 primarily responsible for investigating complaints relating to
- 31 penal or correctional agencies. The citizens' aide shall
- 32 appoint a long-term care resident's advocate who shall be
- 33 responsible for administration of the long-term care
- 34 resident's advocate program established in subchapter II.
- 35 Sec. 3. Section 2C.8, Code 1995, is amended to read as

- 1 follows:
- 2 2C.8 CLOSED FILES.
- 3 The citizens' aide may maintain secrecy in respect to all
- 4 matters including the identities of the complainants or
- 5 witnesses coming before the citizens' aide, except that the
- 6 general assembly, any standing committee of the general
- 7 assembly or the governor may require disclosure of any matter
- 8 and shall have complete access to the records and files of the
- 9 citizens' aide. Records and files maintained for the purposes
- 10 of the long-term care resident's advocate program, however,
- 11 shall be accessible to the extent provided in subchapter II.
- 12 The citizens' aide may conduct private hearings.
- 13 SUBCHAPTER 2
- 14 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 2C.24 PURPOSE.
- The purpose of this subchapter is to establish the long-
- 16 term care resident's advocate program operated by the office
- 17 of the citizens' aide in accordance with the requirements of
- 18 the Older Americans Act of 1965, and to adopt the supporting
- 19 federal regulations and guidelines for its implementation.
- 20 Notwithstanding section 2C.9, subsection 5, the office of the
- 21 citizens' aide shall adopt rules in accordance with chapter
- 22 17A to administer this subchapter. This requirement to adopt
- 23 rules for the administration of this subchapter does not
- 24 affect the exemption in section 2C.9, subsection 5, with
- 25 regard to rules for the administration of subchapter 1.
- 26 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 2C.25 LONG-TERM CARE RESIDENT'S
- 27 ADVOCATE -- DUTIES.
- The office of the citizens' aide, in accordance with
- 29 section 3027(a)(12) of the federal Act, shall establish the
- 30 office of long-term care resident's advocate within the
- 31 office. The long-term care resident's advocate shall do all
- 32 of the following:
- 33 1. Investigate and resolve complaints about administrative
- 34 actions that may adversely affect the health, safety, welfare,
- 35 or rights of elderly in long-term care facilities.

- Monitor the development and implementation of federal,
- 2 state, and local laws, regulations, and policies that relate
- 3 to long-term care facilities in Iowa.
- 4 3. Provide information to other agencies and to the public
- 5 about the problems of elderly in long-term care facilities.
- 6 4. Train volunteers and assist in the development of
- 7 citizens' organizations to participate in the long-term care
- 8 resident's advocate program.
- 9 5. Carry out other activities consistent with the
- 10 resident's advocate provisions of the federal Act.
- 11 6. Administer the care review committee program.
- 12 7. Report annually to the general assembly on the
- 13 activities of the resident's advocate office.
- 14 The resident's advocate shall have access to long-term care
- 15 facilities, private access to residents, access to residents'
- 16 personal and medical records, and access to other records
- 17 maintained by the facilities or governmental agencies
- 18 pertaining only to the person on whose behalf a complaint is
- 19 being investigated.
- 20 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 2C.26 AUTHORITY AND
- 21 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE OFFICE OF THE CITIZENS' AIDE.
- 22 To ensure compliance with the federal Act the office of the
- 23 citizens' aide shall establish all of the following:
- 24 l. Procedures to protect the confidentiality of a
- 25 resident's records and files.
- 26 2. A statewide uniform reporting system.
- 27 3. Procedures to enable the long-term care resident's
- 28 advocate to elicit, receive, and process complaints regarding
- 29 administrative actions which may adversely affect the health,
- 30 safety, welfare, or rights of elderly in long-term care
- 31 facilities.
- 32 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 2C.27 CARE REVIEW COMMITTEE --
- 33 DUTIES -- DISCLOSURE -- LIABILITY.
- 34 1. The care review committee program is administered by
- 35 the long-term care resident's advocate program.

- 2. The responsibilities of the care review committee are
- 2 in accordance with the rules adopted by the office of the
- 3 citizens' aide pursuant to chapter 17A. When adopting the
- 4 rules, the office of the citizens' aide shall consider the
- 5 needs of residents of each category of licensed health care
- 6 facility as defined in section 135C.1, and the services each
- 7 facility may render. The office of the citizens' aide shall
- 8 coordinate the development of rules with the mental health and
- 9 developmental disabilities commission created in section
- 10 225C.5 to the extent the rules would apply to a facility
- ll primarily serving persons with mental illness, mental
- 12 retardation, or a developmental disability. The office of the
- 13 citizens' aide shall coordinate the development of appropriate
- 14 rules with other state agencies.
- 3. A health care facility shall disclose the names,
- 16 addresses, and phone numbers of a resident's family members,
- 17 if requested, to a care review committee member, unless
- 18 permission for this disclosure is refused in writing by a
- 19 family member.
- 20 Neither the state nor any care review committee member
- 21 is liable for an action undertaken by a care review committee
- 22 member in the performance of duty, if the action is undertaken
- 23 and carried out in good faith.
- 24 Sec. 8. Section 135C.25, subsection 2, Code 1995, is
- 25 amended to read as follows:
- Each care review committee shall periodically review 26
- 27 the needs of each individual resident of the facility and
- 28 shall perform the functions pursuant to sections 2C.27 and
- 29 135C.38 and-231-44.
- 30 Sec. 9. Section 135C.37, Code 1995, is amended to read as
- 31 follows:
- 32 135C.37 COMPLAINTS ALLEGING VIOLATIONS -- CONFIDENTIALITY.
- A person may request an inspection of a health care 33
- 34 facility by filing with the department, care review committee
- 35 of the facility, or the long-term care resident's advocate as

- 1 defined established in section 231-47-subsection-16 2C.24, a
- 2 complaint of an alleged violation of applicable requirements
- 3 of this chapter or the rules adopted pursuant to this chapter.
- 4 A person alleging abuse or neglect of a resident with a
- 5 developmental disability or with mental illness may also file
- 6 a complaint with the protection and advocacy agency designated
- 7 pursuant to section 135B.9 or section 135C.2. A copy of a
- 8 complaint filed with the care review committee or the long-
- 9 term care resident's advocate shall be forwarded to the
- 10 department and the office of the citizens' aide established in
- 11 section 2C.2. The complaint shall state in a reasonably
- 12 specific manner the basis of the complaint, and a statement of
- 13 the nature of the complaint shall be delivered to the facility
- 14 involved at the time of the inspection. The name of the
- 15 person who files a complaint with the department, care review
- 16 committee, or the long-term care resident's advocate shall be
- 17 kept confidential and shall not be subject to discovery,
- 18 subpoena, or other means of legal compulsion for its release
- 19 to a person other than department employees involved in the
- 20 investigation of the complaint.
- 21 Sec. 10. Section 135C.38, subsection 2, paragraph d, Code
- 22 1995, is amended to read as follows:
- 23 d. A person who is dissatisfied with any aspect of the
- 24 department's handling of the complaint may contact the long-
- 25 term care resident's advocate, established pursuant to section
- 26 231-42 2C.24, or may contact the protection and advocacy
- 27 agency designated pursuant to section 135C.2 if the complaint
- 28 relates to a resident with a developmental disability or a
- 29 mental illness.
- 30 Sec. 11. Section 231.4, subsection 16, Code 1995, is
- 31 amended by striking the subsection.
- 32 Sec. 12. Section 231.14, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code
- 33 1995, is amended to read as follows:
- 34 The commission is the policymaking body of the sole state
- 35 agency responsible for administration of the Older Americans

- 1 Act of 1965, as amended with the exception of the long-term
- 2 care resident's advocate program established in section 2C.24.
- 3 The commission shall:
- Sec. 13. Section 231.33, subsections 18 and 21, Code 1995,
- 5 are amended to read as follows:
- 18. Coordinate activities in support of the statewide
- 7 long-term care resident's advocate program established in
- 8 section 2C.24.
- 21. Submit a report to the department-of-elder-affairs
- 10 office of the citizens' aide every six months, of the name of
- ll each health care facility in its area for which the care
- 12 review committee has failed to submit the report required by
- 13 rules adopted pursuant to section 231-44 2C.27.
- 14 Sec. 14. Section 231A.2, subsection 1, paragraph b, Code
- 15 1995, is amended to read as follows:
- The responsible party shall comply with visitation and 16
- 17 assessment requirements as determined by the office of the
- 18 citizens' aide in cooperation with the department.
- 19 Sec. 15. Section 231A.2, subsection 8, Code 1995, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- The office of the citizens' aide in cooperation with
- 22 the commission shall adopt by rule procedures for appointing
- 23 members of a care review committee for each elder family home.
- 24 To the maximum extent possible, the care review committee
- 25 appointed for an elder family home shall include a person
- 26 involved in a local retired senior volunteer program.
- 27 rules shall incorporate the provisions, if applicable, for
- 28 care review committees pursuant to sections 2C.27, 135C.25,
- 29 and 135C.387-and-231-44.
- Sec. 16. Section 231B.2, subsection 2, paragraph g, Code 30
- 31 1995, is amended to read as follows:
- The office of the citizens' aide in cooperation with
- 33 the commission of elder affairs shall adopt by rule procedures
- 34 for appointing members of care review committees for elder
- 35 group homes.

- Sections 231.41 through 231.44, Code 1995, are 2 repealed.
- MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.
- 1. All rules, regulations, forms, orders, and directives
- 5 in effect for the long-term care resident's advocate program
- 6 on the effective date of this Act shall continue in full force
- 7 and effect as rules, regulations, and forms, of the department
- 8 of elder affairs until amended, repealed, or supplemented by
- 9 affirmative action of the office of the citizens' aide.
- On the effective date of this Act, the director of 10
- 11 revenue and finance shall allocate to the office of the
- 12 citizens' aid any funds appropriated to the department of
- 13 elder affairs for the long-term care resident's advocate
- 14 program and the department of elder affairs shall take all
- 15 actions necessary to transfer administration and control of
- 16 the long-term care resident's advocate program to the office
- 17 of the citizens' aide, including, but not limited to, the
- 18 assignment of contracts, the reassignment of personnel, and
- 19 transfer of records and supplies, as applicable.
- Sec. 19. EFFECTIVE DATES. 20
- 1. Section 18 of this Act, being deemed of immediate 21
- 22 importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 2. Sections 1 through 17 of this Act take effect January 23
- 24 1, 1996.
- 25 EXPLANATION
- 26 This bill provides for the reestablishment of the long-term
- 27 care resident's advocate program in the office of the
- 28 citizens' aide rather than in the department of elder affairs.
- 29 The bill also provides for cooperation between the department
- 30 of elder affairs and the office of the citizens' aide in
- 31 certain instances and makes conforming changes throughout the
- 32 Code.
- The bill also provides for an effective date of January 1, 33
- 34 1996.
