26 BACKGROUND STATEMENT

27 SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY

28 This bill completes the statutory changes initiated during
29 the 1994 session in H.F. 2410 to eliminate the disparate
30 process by which birth certificates are filed based on marital
31 status. Currently, county registrars are not allowed to
32 accept and file birth certificates when the mother is unwed.
33 This requires that out-of-wedlock birth certificates must be
34 filed directly with the state registrar. This legislation
35 eliminates that practice and the stigma of filing out-of-

1 wedlock births, removes unnecessary encumbrances on the county
2 registrar, and allows the state registrar to share information
3 on all births with the local boards of health for the purposes
4 of promoting increased immunization rates of infants and
5 children.

6 The athletic trainer advisory board recommends a technical
7 correction which inadvertently establishes a different
8 standard of licensing candidates from out-of-state. Both in-
9 state and out-of-state licensees would be required to complete
10 approved training and pass an examination.
