Currently, the county board of supervisors in consultation with the county engineer may classify area service system roads for the purpose of determining levels of maintenance. The county has the authority to classify "A" and "B" area service system roads.

This bill allows the county board of supervisors to designate area service roads as class "C" roads to allow for or restricted access and a minimal level of maintenance. Roads all may only be classified as area service "C" by ordinance or resolution upon petition signed by all landowners adjoining the road. The ordinance or resolution must specify the level of maintenance effort and the persons who will have access rights to the road. The county may restrict access to the
