A BILL FOR 1 An Act making truancy by a child under the age of twelve a basis for a child in need of assistance petition and making truancy by a child, who has reached the age of twelve and is under the age of sixteen, a delinquent act, and providing conditional effectiveness. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 232.2, subsection 6, Code 1995, is
- 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph:
- 3 NEW PARAGRAPH. p. Who is under the age of twelve and is
- 4 deemed truant under section 299.8.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 232.2, subsection 12, Code 1995, is
- 6 amended by adding the following new paragraph:
- 7 NEW PARAGRAPH. c. A violation under section 299.13.
- 8 Sec. 3. Section 299.8, Code 1995, is amended to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 299.8 "TRUANT" DEFINED.
- 11 Any child of compulsory attendance age who fails to attend
- 12 school as provided in this chapter, or as required by the
- 13 school board's or school governing body's attendance policy,
- 14 or who fails to attend competent private instruction under
- 15 chapter 299A, without reasonable excuse for the absence, shall
- 16 be deemed to be a truant. A finding that a child age twelve
- 17 or older is truant, -however, shall not by itself mean that the
- 18 child is a child in need of assistance within the meaning of
- 19 chapter 232 and shall not be the sole basis for a child in
- 20 need of assistance petition. A child under the age of twelve
- 21 deemed truant is a child in need of assistance as provided in
- 22 section 232.2, subsection 6.
- 23 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 299.13 TRUANCY -- DELINQUENT ACT.
- 24 A child who has reached the age of twelve and is under the
- 25 age of sixteen, who has run away from home to avoid attending
- 26 school, or who is refusing to attend school, or who has been
- 27 deemed truant fifteen or more school days in one school year,
- 28 and whose child's parent, guardian, or legal or actual
- 29 custodian and school officials have made reasonable efforts to
- 30 cause the child to attend school, shall have committed a
- 31 delinquent act and is subject to the applicable provisions of
- 32 chapter 232.
- 33 Sec. 5. CONDITIONAL EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act shall not
- 34 take effect unless an appropriation is made that complies with
- 35 section 25B.2, subsection 3.

EXPLANATION

This bill changes the definition of "truant" to provide
that a finding that a child under the age of 12 is truant
means, by itself, that the child is a child in need of
sassistance and is basis for a child in need of assistance
petition. A child between the ages of 12 and 17 shall have
committed a delinquent act if the child has run away from home
to avoid attending school, or is refusing to attend school, or
has been deemed truant 15 or more school days in a school
year, and whose child's parent, guardian, or legal or actual
custodian and the school officials at the school in which the
child is enrolled have made reasonable efforts to cause the
child to attend school.

This bill may contain a state mandate under chapter 25B.

The bill shall not take effect unless an appropriation under
section 25B.2, subsection 3, is made, fully funding the cost
for the bill or funding the state's proportionate share of the
scott.
