1 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of 2 the State of Iowa is proposed.

3 Section 1 of Article $I$ of the Constitution of the State of 4 Iowa, is amended to read as follows:

5 RIGHTS OF PERSONS. Section 1. All men and women are, by
6 nature, free and equal, and have certain inalienable rights --
7 among which are those of enjoying and defending life and 8 liberty, acquiring, possessing and protecting property, and

EXPLANATION

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the State of Iowa is proposed.

Section 1 of Article $I$ of the Constitution of the State of Iowa, is amended to read as follows:

RIGHTS OF PERSONS. Section $1 . ~ A l l$ men and women are, by nature, free and equal, and have certain inalienable rights -among which are those of enjoying and defending life and liberty, acquiring, possessing and protecting property, and pursuing and obtaining safety and happiness.

Sec. 2. The foregoing amendment to the constitution of the State of Iowa is referred to the General Assembly to be chosen at the next general election for members of the General Assembly and the Secretary of State is directed to cause the
