Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of 2 the State of Iowa is proposed:

3 1. Section 3 of Article III of the Constitution of the 4 State of Iowa is repealed and the following adopted in lieu 5 thereof:

6 REPRESENTATIVES. SEC. 3. The members of the House of 7 Representatives shall be chosen by the qualified electors of 8 their respective districts, and their term of office shall 9 commence on the first day of January following their election 10 which is not a Sunday or legal holiday, and continue four 11 years, and until their successors are elected and qualified. 12 Representatives shall be classified by statute so that as 13 nearly as possible one-half of the members of the House of 14 Representatives shall be elected every two years.

15 The General Assembly shall make such changes in the law 16 governing the time of election and terms of office of 17 Representatives as shall be necessary to make the time of 18 their election and terms of office conform to this amendment. 19 2. Section 5 of Article III of the Constitution of the 20 State of Iowa is repealed and the following adopted in lieu 21 thereof:

22 SENATORS -- QUALIFICATIONS. SEC. 5. Senators shall be 23 chosen for a term of six years, at the same time and place as 24 Representatives; they shall be twenty-five years of age, and 25 possess the qualifications of Representatives as to residence 26 and citizenship. The General Assembly shall make such changes 27 in the law governing the time of election and terms of office 28 of Senators as shall be necessary to make the time of their 29 election and terms of office conform to this amendment.

30 3. Section 6 of Article III of the Constitution of the 31 State of Iowa, as amended by amendment number 3 of the 32 Amendments of 1968, is repealed and the following adopted in 33 lieu thereof:

34 SENATORS -- NUMBER AND CLASSIFICATION. SEC. 6. The number 35 of Senators shall total not more than one-half the membership

1 of the House of Representatives. Senators shall be classified 2 by statute so that as nearly as possible one-third of the 3 members of the Senate shall be elected every two years.

4 4. Section 35 of Article III of the Constitution of the 5 State of Iowa, as amended by amendment number 4 of Amendments 6 of 1868, amendment number 2 of the Amendments of 1904, and 7 amendment number 3 of the Amendments of 1968, is repealed and 8 the following adopted in lieu thereof:

SENATORS AND REPRESENTATIVES -- NUMBER AND DISTRICTS. SEC. 9 10 35. The General Assembly shall in each year immediately 11 following the United States decennial census determine the 12 number of Senators and Representatives to be elected to the 13 General Assembly and establish senatorial and representative 14 districts. The General Assembly shall complete the 15 apportionment prior to September 1 of the year so required. 16 If the apportionment fails to become law prior to September 15 17 of such year, the Supreme Court shall cause the State to be 18 apportioned into senatorial and representative districts to 19 comply with the requirements of the Constitution prior to 20 December 31 of such year. The reapportioning authority shall, 21 where necessary in establishing senatorial and representative 22 districts, shorten the term of any Senator or Representative 23 prior to completion of the term. Any Senator or 24 Representative whose term is so terminated shall not be 25 compensated for the uncompleted part of the term.

Sec. 2. The foregoing amendment to the Constitution of the State of Iowa is referred to the General Assembly to be chosen at the next general election for members of the General Assembly and the Secretary of State is directed to cause the same to be published for three consecutive months previous to 1 the date of that election as provided by law.

33 This joint resolution proposes a constitutional amendment 34 to provide members of the house of representatives with terms 35 of four years and members of the senate with terms of six

1 years. The amendment provides that one-third of the members 2 of the Senate and one-half of the members of the House of 3 Representatives are to be elected every two years.

4 The resolution, if adopted, would be referred to the next 5 general assembly before being submitted to the electorate for 6 ratification.
