1 28 residents, including multifamily dwelling complexes having

1 30 (2) An intensive one-day seminar for the commercial sector  
1 31 regarding the benefits of and opportunities for waste  
1 32 reduction and recycling.  
1 33 (3) Promotion of recycling through targeted community and  
1 34 media events.  
1 35 (4) Recycling notification and education packets to all  
2 1 new residential, commercial, and institutional collection  
2 2 service customers that include, at a minimum, the manner of  
2 3 preparation of materials for collection, and the reasons for  
2 4 separation of materials for recycling.  
2 5 EXPLANATION  
2 6 This bill amends section 455D.3, to provide that planning  
2 7 areas that do not meet the July 1, 1994, waste reduction and  
2 8 recycling goals are not required to remit an additional 50  
2 9 cents per ton tonnage fee to the department of natural  
2 10 resources.
