1 Section 1. STATE PERCENT OF GROWTH. There is established  
2 pursuant to section 257.8, subsection 1, for the school budget  
3 year beginning July 1, 1995, for the state school foundation  
4 program a state percent of growth equal to four and one-half  
5 percent.

6 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of  
7 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment and is  
8 applicable for computing state aid under the state school

11 EXPLANATION

12 This bill establishes for the school budget year beginning  
13 July 1, 1995, for the state school foundation aid program a  
14 state percent of growth equal to 4.5 percent. Section 257.8  
15 of the Code, rewritten in 1992, states that the state percent  
16 of growth for a budget year be established by statute within  
17 30 days of the submission in the base year of the governor's  
18 budget to the general assembly. The bill takes effect upon  
19 enactment.

We, the undersigned members of the conference committee appointed to resolve the differences between the Senate and the House of Representatives on Senate File 17, a bill for an Act establishing the state percent of growth for the school budget year beginning July 1, 1995, for purposes of the state school foundation program and providing effective and applicability date provisions, respectfully make the following report:

1. That the House recedes from its amendment, S-3026.

2. That Senate File 17, as passed by the Senate, is amended as follows:

AN ACT

ESTABLISHING THE STATE PERCENT OF GROWTH FOR THE SCHOOL BUDGET YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1995, FOR PURPOSES OF THE STATE SCHOOL FOUNDATION PROGRAM AND PROVIDING EFFECTIVE AND APPLICABILITY DATE PROVISIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. STATE PERCENT OF GROWTH. There is established pursuant to section 257.8, subsection 1, for the school budget year beginning July 1, 1995, for the state school foundation program a state percent of growth equal to three and one-half percent.

Sec. 2. Notwithstanding the thirty-day deadline for the enactment of the state percent of growth provided in section 257.8, subsection 1, such deadline shall not apply to the Act enacted which establishes the state percent of growth during the 1995 Session of the Seventy-sixth General Assembly.

Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment and is applicable for computing state aid under the state school
