A BILL FOR 1 An Act relating to prohibiting the assault of an emergency medical care provider or a health care provider providing emergency services in a hospital and providing penalties. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 708.3A, Code Supplement 1995, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 708.3A ASSAULTS ON PEACE OFFICERS, AND FIRE FIGHTERS, AND
- 4 EMERGENCY-CARE-PROVIDERS.
- 5 1. A person who commits an assault, as defined in section
- 6 708.1, against a peace officer,-basic-emergency-medical-care
- 7 provider-under-chapter-147,-an-advanced-emergency-medical-care
- 8 provider-under-chapter-147A, or fire fighter, whether paid or
- 9 volunteer, with the knowledge that the person against whom the
- 10 assault is committed is a peace officer,-basic-emergency
- 11 medical-care-provider-under-chapter-147,-an-advanced-emergency
- 12 medical-care-provider-under-chapter-147A, or fire fighter and
- 13 with the intent to inflict a serious injury upon the peace
- 14 officer,-basic-emergency-medical-care-provider-under-chapter
- 15 1477-an-advanced-emergency-medical-care-provider-under-chapter
- 16 ±47A, or fire fighter, is guilty of a class "D" felony.
- 17 2. A person who commits an assault, as defined in section

- 11 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 708.3B ASSAULTS ON EMERGENCY HEALTH
- 12 CARE PROVIDERS.
- 13 1. A person who commits an assault, as defined in section
- 14 708.1, against an emergency health care provider, with the
- 15 knowledge that the person against whom the assault is
- 16 committed is an emergency health care provider and with the
- 17 intent to inflict a serious injury upon the emergency health
- 18 care provider, is quilty of a class "D" felony.
- 19 2. A person who commits an assault, as defined in section
- 20 708.1, against an emergency health care provider, who knows
- 21 that the person against whom the assault is committed is an
- 22 emergency health care provider and who uses or displays a
- 23 dangerous weapon in connection with the assault, is guilty of
- 24 a class "D" felony.
- 25 3. A person who commits an assault, as defined in section
- 26 708.1, against an emergency health care provider, who knows
- 27 that the person against whom the assault is committed is an
- 28 emergency health care provider and who causes bodily injury or
- 29 disabling mental illness, is guilty of an aggravated
- 30 misdemeanor.
- 31 4. Any other assault, as defined in section 708.1,
- 32 committed against an emergency health care provider by a
- 33 person who knows that the person against whom the assault is
- 34 committed is an emergency health care provider, is guilty of a
- 35 serious misdemeanor.

5. As used in this section, "emergency health care

2 provider" means an emergency medical care provider as defined

- 3 in chapter 147A or a person licensed under chapter 148, 148C,
- 4 150, 150A, or 152 who is authorized to provide and is
- 5 providing emergency services in a hospital.
- 6 EXPLANATION
- 7 This bill establishes penalties for the assault of
- 8 emergency health care providers. An emergency health care
- 9 provider is defined in the bill as an emergency medical care
- 10 provider or a licensed physician or surgeon, physician
- 11 assistant, osteopath, osteopathic physician or surgeon, or
- 12 nurse who is authorized and is providing emergency services in
- 13 a hospital.
- 14 If the person committing the assault commits the assault
- 15 with the knowledge that the person, against whom the assault
- 16 is committed, is an emergency health care provider and either
- 17 has the intent of inflicting serious injury or uses or
- 18 displays a dangerous weapon in connection with the assault,
- 19 the person is guilty of a class "D" felony which carries a
- 20 maximum sentence of confinement for no more than five years
- 21 and in addition a possible fine of at least \$500 but not more
- 22 than \$7,500. If the person committing the assault commits the
- 23 assault with the knowledge that the person against whom the
- 24 assault is committed is an emergency health care provider and
- 25 causes bodily injury or disabling mental illness, the person
- 26 is guilty of an aggravated misdemeanor which carries a maximum
- 27 sentence of imprisonment not to exceed two years and a fine of
- 28 at least \$500 but not to exceed \$5,000. If the person commits
- 29 any other type of assault and the person knows that the person
- 30 against whom the assault is committed is an emergency health
- 31 care provider, the person is guilty of a serious misdemeanor
- 32 for which the maximum sentence is a fine of at least \$250 but
- 33 not to exceed \$1,500 and the possibility of imprisonment not
- 34 to exceed one year.
- 35 The bill also amends existing law to separate the
