A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to public health issues, including certain birth  
2 certificates and licensing of athletic trainers.  
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 144.13, subsection 1, paragraph d, Code  
2 1995, is amended to read as follows:

3 ~~d. In-the-case-of-a-child-born-out-of-wedlock,-the~~  
4 ~~certificate-shall-be-filed-directly-with-the-state-registrar-~~  
5 ~~On-a-monthly-basis,-the~~ The state registrar shall may transmit  
6 to the appropriate county local boards of health such  
7 information from birth certificates for the sole purpose of  
8 identifying those children in need of ~~inoculations~~  
9 immunizations.

10 Sec. 2. Section 152D.3, subsection 2, Code 1995, is  
11 amended to read as follows:

12 2. An out-of-state applicant for an athletic trainer  
13 license must fulfill the requirements of subsection 1,  
14 paragraph paragraphs "a" or and "b", and submit proof of  
15 active engagement as an athletic trainer in the other state.

16 EXPLANATION

17 Section 1 strikes the separate process by which out-of-  
18 wedlock birth certificates are filed directly to the  
19 department of public health. Additionally, the department  
20 would be allowed to provide information from all births to  
21 local public health officials to support immunization  
22 activities.

23 Section 2 establishes the same requirements for an athletic  
24 trainer license for in-state and out-of-state licensee  
25 candidates.

26 BACKGROUND STATEMENT

27 SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY

28 This bill completes the statutory changes initiated during  
29 the 1994 session in H.F. 2410 to eliminate the disparate  
30 process by which birth certificates are filed based on marital  
31 status. Currently, county registrars are not allowed to  
32 accept and file birth certificates when the mother is unwed.  
33 This requires that out-of-wedlock birth certificates must be  
34 filed directly with the state registrar. This legislation  
35 eliminates that practice and the stigma of filing out-of-

1 wedlock births, removes unnecessary encumbrances on the county  
2 registrar, and allows the state registrar to share information  
3 on all births with the local boards of health for the purposes  
4 of promoting increased immunization rates of infants and  
5 children.

6 The athletic trainer advisory board recommends a technical  
7 correction which inadvertently establishes a different  
8 standard of licensing candidates from out-of-state. Both in-  
9 state and out-of-state licensees would be required to complete  
10 approved training and pass an examination.

AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC HEALTH ISSUES, INCLUDING CERTAIN BIRTH CERTIFICATES AND LICENSING OF ATHLETIC TRAINERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 144.13, subsection 1, paragraph d, Code 1995, is amended to read as follows:

d. ~~In the case of a child born out of wedlock, the certificate shall be filed directly with the state registrar. On a monthly basis, the~~ The state registrar shall may transmit to the appropriate county local boards of health such information from birth certificates for the sole purpose of identifying those children in need of inoculations immunizations.
