3 "county." the following: "Notwithstanding this
4 subsection, the county board of supervisors may waive
5 the additional tonnage fee for a county, city, or
6 individually contracted industry which is located
7 outside of the county if solid waste received from the
8 county, city, or individually contracted industry
9 accounts for not more than three-tenths of one percent
10 of the annual total amount of solid waste disposed of
11 at the sanitary landfill."

1 Section 1. Section 455B.310, Code Supplement 1995, is
2 amended by adding the following new subsection:

3 NEW SUBSECTION. 8. A county in which a privately operated
4 sanitary landfill accepts solid waste from outside of the
5 county may charge an additional tonnage fee for the disposal
6 of all solid waste at the sanitary landfill. The additional
7 fee charged and the moneys collected shall be used exclusively
8 by the county for the development and implementation of
9 alternatives to sanitary landfills, for the costs incurred by
10 the county to abate problems associated with the operation of
11 the sanitary landfill, or for inspections of the sanitary
12 landfill by the county.

13 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of
14 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

15 EXPLANATION

16 This bill provides that a county in which a privately
17 operated sanitary landfill accepts solid waste from outside of
18 the county may charge an additional tonnage fee for disposal
19 of all solid waste at the sanitary landfill. The moneys
20 collected shall be used for the development and implementation
21 of alternatives to sanitary landfills, for the abatement of
22 problems associated with the operation of the sanitary
23 landfill, or for inspections of the sanitary landfill by the
24 county. The bill takes effect upon enactment.

Senate File 2022 as amended by H-5511 allows the county and city to charge an additional tonnage fee for disposal of all solid waste within the county or city, respectively.

ASSUMPTIONS

1. A county may charge an additional tonnage fee up to a maximum of \$11.00 per ton of solid waste.
2. A city may charge an additional tonnage fee up to a maximum of \$3.33 per ton of solid waste.
3. The revenue generated by the additional fees will be credited to the general fund of the originator of the fee.
4. No estimate of participating counties or cities can be obtained.

FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impact of Senate File 2022 as amended by H-5511, cannot be determined, due to insufficient information.

1 Amend Senate File 2022 as amended, passed, and
2 reprinted by the Senate, as follows:

3 1. By striking everything after the enacting
4 clause and inserting the following:

5 "Section 1. NEW SECTION. 455B.310A LOCAL FEE
6 AUTHORITY.

7 1. The general assembly recognizes that counties
8 and cities with sanitary landfills within their
9 jurisdiction are subject to a higher degree of
10 environmental and other risks, as well as higher costs
11 related to infrastructure demands and future
12 environmental remediation. Therefore, the general
13 assembly finds it appropriate to provide local
14 governments the authority to impose additional tonnage
15 fees that will mitigate the environmental risks and
16 additional costs local governments incur from a
17 sanitary landfill within their jurisdiction.

18 2. A county may impose an additional tonnage fee
19 not to exceed eleven dollars for each ton or
20 equivalent volume of solid waste received and disposed
21 of at a sanitary landfill located within the county.
22 A city may impose an additional tonnage fee not to
23 exceed three dollars and thirty-three cents for each
24 ton or equivalent volume of solid waste received and
25 disposed of at a sanitary landfill located within the
26 city. Revenue from the additional tonnage fee shall
27 be credited to the general fund of the county or city
28 collecting the additional tonnage fee and shall be
29 used only for landfill abatement purposes, or costs of
30 closure, postclosure care, and response actions, or
31 for purposes of mitigating and compensating for the
32 local risks, costs, and other adverse effects of
33 sanitary landfills. A county or city shall not impose
34 an additional tonnage fee on wastes that are exempt
35 from tonnage fees as provided in section 455B.310,
36 subsections 3 and 7.

37 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of
38 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment."
