1 Section 1. Section 91D.1, subsection 1, paragraphs a and 2 d, Code 1995, are amended to read as follows:

An employee who has completed ninety calendar 11 days of employment with the employer prior to July 1,1996 , 12 January $1_{\perp}$ of $-799 \theta$ 1997, $\ddagger 997$ or $\ddagger 99 z$ July 1,1997 , shall
13 earn the applicable hourly minimum wage. An employer shall
14 pay an employee who has not completed ninety calendar days of 15 employment with the employer an hourly wage of at least \$3.35 16 \$4.85 as of fantary July 1, of $- \pm 99 \theta$ 1996, $\$ 3.85$ \$5.00 as of

## EXPLANATION

This bill increases the hourly minimum wage requirement for employees with 90 calendar days of employment with the employer to $\$ 5$ on July $1,1996, \$ 5.50$ on January 1,1997 , and $\$ 6$ on July l, 1997. Those with fewer than 90 calendar days of employment by those dates shall earn a minimum wage of $\$ 4.85$, $\$ 5$, and $\$ 5.50$, respectively.
