A BILL FOR

1 An Act making an appropriation to the department of natural
2 resources for statewide forestry and rural development through
3 forestry projects in cooperation with resource, conservation,
4 and development areas.

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of
2 the state to the department of natural resources for the
3 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1996, and ending June 30, 1997,
4 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to
5 be used for the purpose designated:

6 For statewide forestry and rural development through
7 forestry projects in cooperation with resource, conservation,
8 and development areas, as authorized under the Food and
9 Agriculture Act of 1962, 16 U.S.C. § 3451-3461, and
10 reauthorized under the Food, Agriculture, Conservation, and
11 Trade Act of 1990, 16 U.S.C. § 3459-3461, and to administer
12 the program in cooperation with the United States department
13 of agriculture's natural resources conservation service:
14 \$ 1,000,000

15 EXPLANATION

16 The 1990 federal farm bill established the rural
17 development through forestry (RDTF) program, 7 U.S.C. § 6601-
18 6617. The program is administered by the United States
19 department of agriculture's forest service and implemented
20 through state forestry agencies. Iowa was designated as a
21 pilot state under the federal RDTF program.

22 Rural development through forestry, as administered by the
23 department of natural resources, provides matching grants to
24 local entities for economic development based on forest
25 resources. In the state of Iowa's pilot program, local
26 projects were identified and carried out primarily through
27 nine resource, conservation, and development (RC&D) areas.

28 RC&D areas are private, not-for-profit corporations that
29 are organized pursuant to chapter 504A of the Code of Iowa.
30 RC&D areas are locally governed by volunteer directors with
31 required representation by the county boards of supervisors,
32 the local soil and water conservation districts, and local
33 people interested in the program. The purpose of RC&D areas
34 is grass-roots directed development of human, economic, and
35 natural resources. RC&D areas were authorized under the Food

1 and Agriculture Act of 1962, 16 U.S.C. § 3451-3461, and
2 reauthorized under the Food, Agriculture, Conservation, and
3 Trade Act of 1990, 16 U.S.C. § 3459-3461.

4 This bill appropriates \$1,000,000 from the general fund of
5 the state to the department of natural resources for the
6 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1996, and ending June 30, 1997,
7 for statewide forestry and rural development through forestry
8 projects in cooperation with RC&D areas and to administer the
9 program in cooperation with the United States department of
10 agriculture's natural resources conservation service.
