Section 256.7, subsection 19, paragraph b, Code 2 1995, is amended to read as follows: If the total hours of instructional school time for 4 grades one through twelve for any five consecutive school days 5 equal a minimum of twenty-seven and one-half hours, even 6 though any one day of school is less than the minimum 7 instructional hours because of a staff development opportunity 8 provided for the professional instructional staff or because 9 parent-teacher conferences have been scheduled beyond the 10 regular school day. Section 1. Section 256.7, subsection 19, paragraph b, Code 1995, is amended to read as follows:

b. If the total hours of instructional school time for grades one through twelve for any five consecutive school days equal a minimum of twenty-seven and one-half hours, even though any one day of school is less than the minimum instructional hours because of a staff development opportunity provided for the professional instructional staff or because parent-teacher conferences have been scheduled beyond the regular school day. Furthermore, if the total hours of instructional time for the first four consecutive days equal at least twenty-seven and one-half hours because parent-teacher conferences have been scheduled beyond the regular school day, a school or school district may record zero hours
