A BILL FOR

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Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 142C.15 ANATOMICAL GIFT PUBLIC
 2 AWARENESS AND TRANSPLANTATION FUND -- ESTABLISHED -- USES OF

4 1. a. An anatomical gift public awareness and 5 transplantation fund is created as a separate fund in the 6 state treasury under the control of the Iowa department of 7 public health. The fund shall consist of moneys remitted by 8 the county treasurer of a county or by the department of 9 transportation which were collected through the payment of a 10 contribution made by an applicant for registration of a motor 11 vehicle pursuant to section 321.44A and any other 12 contributions to the fund.

b. The moneys collected under this section and deposited in the fund are appropriated to the Iowa department of public health for the purposes specified in this section. Moneys in the fund shall not be subject to appropriation or expenditure for any other purpose.

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321.44A VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION --1 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 2 ANATOMICAL GIFT PUBLIC AWARENESS AND TRANSPLANTATION FUND. For each application for registration or renewal, the 3 4 county treasurer or the department shall request through use 5 of a written form, and, if the application is made in person, 6 through verbal communication, that an applicant make a 7 voluntary contribution of one dollar or more to the anatomical 8 gift public awareness and transplantation fund established 9 pursuant to section 142C.15. Moneys collected in the form of 10 contributions shall be remitted to the treasurer of state for 11 deposit in the fund to be used for the purposes specified for 12 the fund. The director shall adopt rules to administer this 13 section.

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## EXPLANATION

This bill establishes an anatomical gift public awareness and transplantation fund as a separate fund within the state treasury under the control of the Iowa department of public health and also establishes an anatomical gift public awareness advisory committee within the Iowa department of public health.

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The fund is to consist of moneys collected as contributions made by applicants for registration or renewal of registration of a motor vehicle and any other contributions to the fund. The bill provides that the moneys in the fund are to be distributed as grants to state agencies or nonprofit entities for the purpose of conducting public awareness projects; to hospitals for public awareness projects, referral protocols, and related administrative expenses; and to hospitals on behalf of patients for the costs related to transplantation. The bill specifies that not more than 5 percent of the moneys in the fund be used for administrative costs.

32 The advisory committee is established consisting of 33 representatives of a state organ procurement organization, a 34 bank or storage organization, the Iowa medical society, the 35 association of Iowa hospitals and health systems, the Iowa


11 This bill establishes an anatomical gift awareness and 12 transplantation fund as a separate fund within the state 13 treasury under the control of the Iowa department of public 14 health and also establishes an anatomical gift advisory 15 committee within the Iowa department of public health. The fund is to consist of moneys collected as contributions 16 17 made by applicants for registration or renewal of registration 18 of a motor vehicle and any other contributions to the fund. 19 The bill provides that the moneys in the fund are to be 20 distributed as grants to state agencies or nonprofit entities 21 for the purpose of conducting awareness projects; to hospitals 22 for awareness projects, referral protocols, and related 23 administrative expenses; and to hospitals on behalf of 24 patients for the costs related to transplantation.

The advisory committee is established consisting of representatives of a state organ procurement organization, a bank or storage organization, the Iowa medical society, the association of Iowa hospitals and health systems, the Iowa osteopathic medical association, the Iowa chapter of the national association of social workers, the Iowa department of public health, the department of human services, and the department of inspections and appeals. The duties of the committee include: advising the department regarding the accepting and awarding of grants to promote anatomical gifts, setablishing criteria for the application for and awarding of

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vehicle pursuant to section 321.44A and any other contributions to the fund.

b. The moneys collected under this section and deposited in the fund are appropriated to the Iowa department of public health for the purposes specified in this section. Moneys in the fund shall not be subject to appropriation or expenditure for any other purpose.

For each application for registration or renewal, the county treasurer or the department shall request through use of a written form, and, if the application is made in person, through verbal communication, that an applicant make a voluntary contribution of one dollar or more to the anatomical gift public awareness and transplantation fund established pursuant to section 142C.15. Moneys collected in the form of contributions shall be remitted to the treasurer of state for deposit in the fund to be used for the purposes specified for the fund. The director shall adopt rules to administer this section.
