A BILL FOR

1 An Act eliminating the requirement to commence litigation  
2 involving shipments of plants infested with gypsy moths, and  
3 providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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S.F. 2130

1 Section 1. REPEAL. 1995 Iowa Acts, chapter 216, section  
2 27, is repealed.

3 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of  
4 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

5 EXPLANATION

6 In 1995, the general assembly enacted House File 553, which  
7 in part provides that the department of agriculture and land  
8 stewardship and the office of the attorney general shall  
9 cooperate in bringing legal action against parties liable for  
10 damages caused by the shipment from the state of Michigan of  
11 trees or other plants infested with gypsy moths. This bill  
12 repeals that provision. The bill takes effect upon enactment.
