1 An Act relating to school meal programs.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 283A.2, subsection 2, Code 1995, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 2. All school districts shall operate or provide for the
4 operation of school lunch programs at all public schools in
5 each district. A school district may operate or provide for
6 the operation of school breakfast programs at all public
7 schools in the district. The programs shall provide students
8 with nutritionally adequate meals and shall be operated in
9 compliance with the rules of the state board of education and
10 pertinent federal ~~rules~~, laws and regulations. School lunch
11 programs shall be operated for all students in each district
12 who attend public school four or more hours each school day
13 and wish to participate in a school lunch program. School
14 districts may provide school lunch programs for other
15 students.

16 Sec. 2. Section 283A.2, subsection 3, Code 1995, is
17 amended by striking the subsection.

18 Sec. 3. Section 283A.2, subsection 2, Code 1993, as
19 amended by 1994 Iowa Acts, chapter 1193, section 24, and which
20 amendments take effect July 1, 2000, pursuant to 1994 Iowa
21 Acts, chapter 1193, section 38, is amended by striking the
22 subsection.

23 Sec. 4. 1994 Iowa Acts, chapter 1193, sections 36 and 38,
24 are repealed.

25 EXPLANATION

26 This bill strikes a mandate enacted in 1994 to take effect
27 July 1, 1999, requiring schools to provide school breakfast
28 programs. Under the bill, a school district may provide a
29 school breakfast program for all schools in the district, and
30 if the district elects to do so, the program must provide
31 students with nutritionally adequate meals and be operated in
32 compliance with state administrative rules and pertinent
33 federal laws and regulations.
