The bill restricts all-terrain 4 vehicles from operating on freeways and restricts all-terrain 5 vehicles and snowmobiles from operating in any median of a 6 divided highway at any time. The bill repeals section 7 321.234A dealing with all-terrain vehicles and incorporates 8 the provisions of that section within the chapter dealing 9 exclusively with all-terrain vehicles and snowmobiles, chapter 10 321G. A person who violates any provision of chapter 321G is 11 12 guilty of a simple misdemeanor. Violations of section 321G.9, 13 subsections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 7 are subject to a scheduled 14 fine of \$20. 15 BACKGROUND STATEMENT 16 SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY The bill concerns the operation of all-terrain vehicles and 17 18 snowmobiles on roads. The bill defines "freeway" as a fully 19 controlled access highway where access is available only at 20 interchanges. The bill also defines "median" as the portion 21 of a divided highway separating the traveled ways from 22 opposing traffic. To be consistent with current snowmobile regulations, all-24 terrain vehicles will not be allowed to operate on a freeway 25 except under extremely limited circumstances. Currently, snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles can operate

27 within the median of a four-lane divided highway during the 28 daytime but are prohibited at night. In the interest of

29 safety for all vehicular and recreational traffic, this bill

30 prohibits snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles from operating

31 in medians of all four-lane divided highways at all times.
