Section 1. Section 727.10, Code 1995, is amended to read as follows:

727.10 EXHIBITING ~~DEFORMED-OR-ABNORMAL~~ PERSONS.

Any A person who shall not exhibit, place on exhibition, or cause to be exhibited any ~~deformed, maimed, idiotic or abnormal person or human monstrosity~~ without the exhibited ~~person's or human monstrosity's consent, and receive any fee or compensation therefor,~~ permission of the person exhibited or the person's parent or guardian. A parent or guardian of an exhibited person shall not receive compensation from the
