          This bill conforms the statutory definition of travel
 1 19 trailer to the statutorily authorized width for travel
  1 20 trailers and certain other vehicles which is eight feet six
  1 21 inches. Section 321.454 was amended in 1994 to provide that
  1 22 travel trailers having a total outside width not exceeding
  1 23 eight feet six inches are exempt from excessive size and
  1 24 weight permitting requirements of chapter 321E and may be
  1 25 operated on the roads of the state; however, the definition of
  1 26 travel trailer in section 321.1 was not amended.
