3 A Concurrent Resolution establishing a committee  
4 to study and make recommendations concerning  
5 the management of solid waste and recycling.

6 WHEREAS, it is the intent of the General Assembly  
7 to encourage and facilitate solid waste reduction and  
8 recycling efforts in the state; and

9 WHEREAS, it is the intent of the General Assembly  
10 to consider incentives for increasing solid waste  
11 reduction and recycling, market development for  
12 recycling, educating the public on solid waste  
13 reduction and recycling issues, technical assistance  
14 for pollution prevention and recycling, and  
15 alternative funding sources for existing programs  
16 related to solid waste reduction and recycling; NOW

17 THEREFORE,

18 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE  
19 SENATE CONCURRING, That a special committee shall be  
20 established to study and make recommendations  
21 regarding the management of solid waste and recycling;  
22 and

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the special committee  
24 shall consist of members with diverse and specialized  
25 expertise in waste management and recycling issues to  
26 be considered by the special committee, including four  
27 members of the General Assembly, with not more than  
28 one member from each chamber being from the same  
29 political party. The two senators shall be designated  
30 by the majority leader of the Senate after

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1 consultation with the minority leader of the Senate.  
2 The two representatives shall be designated by the  
3 Speaker of the House of Representatives after  
4 consultation with the majority and minority leaders of  
5 the House of Representatives.

6 The director of the Department of Natural Resources  
7 is requested to appoint five members with not more  
8 than two members who are current employees of the  
9 department; and

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the cochairpersons of  
11 the special committee shall be the General Assembly  
12 members of the majority party from each chamber; and

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the special committee  
14 shall examine, study, and make recommendations to the  
15 General Assembly regarding all of the following and  
16 any related issues:

17 1. Any current or possible incentives for  
18 increasing solid waste reduction and recycling in the  
19 state.

20 2. Market development for recycling.

21 3. Educating the public on solid waste reduction  
22 and recycling issues.

23 4. Technical assistance for pollution prevention  
24 and recycling.

25 5. Alternative funding sources for existing  
26 programs related to solid waste reduction and  
27 recycling; and

28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the special committee  
29 shall submit a report to the General Assembly no later  
30 than December 1, 1999, which shall include, but not be

1 limited to, findings, analysis, and recommendations by  
2 the special committee.
