WHEREAS, Iowa women were leaders in the abolitionist movement, the emancipation movement, the industrial labor movement, the civil rights movement, the peace movement, and the women's suffrage movement, leading to a more equitable and just society for ali; and

WHEREAS, despite these contributions anc those of women throughout the world, the role of women is consistentiy overlooked and undervalued in ijterature, teaching, and the study of history; NOW THEREFORE,
