18	A House Concurrent Resolution requesting that the
19	legislative council establish an interim study
20	committee to consider increasing the percent of
21	oxygen by weight in motor vehicle fuel.
22	WHEREAS, more than 40 percent of this nation's air
23	pollution is caused by vehicles, emitting a variety of
24	petroleum-based pollutants which endanger the public's
25	health and natural environment, including harmfull
26	organic vapors, benzene and other aromatics, nitrogen
27	oxides, particulate matter in the form of smoke and
28	soot, carbon monoxide, and carbon dioxide; and
29	WHEREAS, motor vehicle fuel which includes a higher
30	percent of oxygen enhances octane levels and provides

- 1 better fuel combustion resulting in reduced levels of
- 2 harmful pollutants; and
- 3 WHEREAS, members of the Iowa House of
- 4 Representatives and Iowa Senate have long supported
- 5 the production of ethanol as a vital component in
- 6 promoting clean air, supporting this state's economy,
- 7 and reducing imported nonrenewable energy sources; and
- 8 WHEREAS, this state has long championed industries
- 9 which add value to agricultural commodities produced
- 10 by farmers in this state; and
- 11 WHEREAS, persons involved in the production and
- 12 processing of corn in Iowa significantly contribute to
- 13 the wealth of this nation by supporting the production
- 14 of agricultural commodities and value-added products;
- 15 NOW THEREFORE,
- 16 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE
- 17 SENATE CONCURRING, That the legislative council is
- 18 requested to establish an interim study committee to
- 19 consider the percent of oxygen by weight currently
- 20 contained in motor vehicle fuel, its effects on this
- 21 state's economy, public health, and natural
- 22 environment, and to investigate methods to increase
- 23 the oxygenate content in motor vehicle fuel in
- 24 appropriate circumstances; and
- 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the interim study
- 26 committee submit its findings and recommendations,
- 27 including any proposed legislation, for consideration
- 28 by the 1999 Session of the Seventy-eighth General
- 29 Assembly.
