9 WHEREAS, it is the intent of the General Assembly 10 to provide for the orderly use and development of land 11 in the state, to preserve private property rights, to 12 preserve the use of prime agricultural land for 13 agricultural production, to preserve natural, 14 cultural, and historical areas, and to provide for the 15 coordination of comprehensive plans for land use; and WHEREAS, it is the intent of the General Assembly 16 17 to control urban sprawl, and thereby provide for the 18 protection and preservation of the private and public 19 interest in the land, water, and related resources of 20 this state for the public nealth, safety, and general 21 welfare, and for the benefit of present and future 22 generations; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE SENATE CONCURRING, That a special commission shall be established to study urban planning, growth management, and farmland protection; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the special commission shall consist of 17 voting members with diverse expertise in planning, development, design, zoning, an annexation, agriculture, historic preservation, and

1 conservation, including all of the following: Four members of the general assembly with not 1. 2 3 more than one member from each chamber being from the 4 same political party. The two senators shall be 5 designated by the majority leader of the Senate after 5 consultation with the minority leader of the Senate. 7 The two representatives shall be designated by the 8 Speaker of the House of Representatives after 9 consultation with the majority and minority leaders of 10 the House of Representatives. Of the members from 11 each chamber, one member shall represent a district 12 which is primarily urban, while the other member shall 13 represent a district which is primarily rural. 14 2. One member appointed by the Governor. The executive director of the Iowa Farm Bureau 15 3. 16 Federation or a designee of the executive director. The executive director of the Iowa Farmers' 17 4. 18 Union or a designee of the executive director. The executive director of the Iowa League of 19 5. 20 Cities or a designee of the executive director. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the co-chairpersons of the special commission shall be the General Assembly members of the majority poly from each chamber; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the special commission shall do all of the following:

1. Review the county land-use inventories compiled pursuant to chapter 352 and survey the status of Iowa farmland and natural areas since the compiletion of the county land-use inventories to determine the residential, commercial, or industrial use. The survey shall also report on the agricultural quality of the farmland converted to residential, commercial,

1 or industrial use.

Survey the problems facing the state's cities
 including, but not limited to, problems involving
 crime, poverty, infrastructure, housing, and taxation.
 3. Evaluate the effectiveness of current state,
 regional, and local planning and zoning laws and
 assess their impact on the farmland, natural areas,
 and cities of the state.

9 4. Review model legislation and studies on 10 farmland protection and urban planning and collect 11 information on states that have undertaken reform 12 efforts and have effective programs.

13 5. During 1997, hold public hearings throughout 14 the state to share the initial findings of the special 15 commission and solicit public comment and input on 16 steps that might be taken to address the charge of the 17 special commission.

Propose innovative and cooperative planning and 19 land-use approaches that will protect farmland, 20 accommodate and guide growth and development, ensure 21 the planning and construction of adequate supporting 22 services and infrastructure including utilities, storm 23 water management systems, and transportation, provide 24 opportunities for or eliminate barriers to affordable 25 housing, protect the environment, minimize exposure to 26 natural hazards, and generally address the concerns 27 outlined in this resolution.

29 hold a second series of public hearings in the fall of
30 1998; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the special commission 2 shall convene each month; and

3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the special commission 4 shall submit an interim report to the General Assembly 5 no later than January 1, 1998, which shall include, 6 but not be limited to, a status report of the 7 commission's actions and an explanation of future 8 plans; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the special commission 10 shall submit a final report to the General Assembly no 11 later than December 1, 1998, which shall include, but 12 not be limited to, findings, analysis, and 13 recommendations by the special commission; and 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislative 15 Council pursuant to its authority in section 2.43 may 16 allocate funding from moneys available to it in 17 section 2.12, to the special commission created in 18 this resolution for studies, consultants, surveys, and 19 reimbursement of any public or private department or 20 agency that provides staffing services for the 21 commission.
