Section 1. Section 49.73, subsection 2, Code 1997, is 1 2 amended to read as follows:

2. The commissioner shall not shorten voting hours for any 3. 4 election if there is filed in the commissioner's office, at 5 least twenty-five days before the election, a petition signed 6 by at least fifty eligible electors of the school district or 7 city, as the case may be, requesting that the polls be opened 8 not later than seven o'clock a.m. All polling places where 9 the candidates of or any public question submitted by any one 10 political subdivision are being voted upon shall be opened at 11 the same hour, except that this requirement shall not apply to 12 merged areas established under chapter 260C. The hours at 13 which the respective precinct polling places are to open shall 14 not be changed after publication of the notice required by 15 section 49.53. The polling places shall be closed at nine 16 otclock eight p.m. for state-primary-and-general-elections-and 17 other-partisan-elections, and for any other-election-held 18 concurrently-therewith7-and-at-eight-o'clock-p-m-for all 19 other elections. 20



"Sec. 2. Section 1 of this Act is repealed, 4 5 effective July 1, 1999. The Code editor shall, upon 6 repeal of section 1 of this Act, return the language 7 of section 49.73, subsection 2, to the language 8 contained in that subsection in the 1997 Code of Iowa. Sec. 3. By January 15, 1999, the secretary of 9 10 state shall report to the general assembly on the 11 comparison of voter turnout rates at those elections 12 where the polls closed at eight o'clock and such 13 elections held prior to enactment of this Act where 14 the polls closed at nine o'clock. HOUSE FILE 140 FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for House File 140 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 140 changes from 9 p.m. to 8 p.m. the hour at which precinct polling places are to close for partisan elections and elections held concurrently with partisan elections.

ASSUMPTIONS

- 1. Closing precinct polling places at 8 p.m. will require poll workers to work one hour less per election per year.
- Poll workers will staff one primary election and one general election per year.
- 3. The number of poll workers required to staff precinct polling places during upcoming elections will remain unchanged from staffing levels required during the most recent general and primary elections.
- 4. The statewide salary cost of providing poll workers to staff primary election precinct polling places for one hour is \$47,242.
- 5. The statewide salary cost of providing poll workers to staff general election precinct polling places for one hour is \$57,836.
- 6. Salaries paid to poll workers are the only savings that will result from closing precinct polling places at 8 p.m.

FISCAL IMPACT

The bill will have no fiscal impact on the State General Fund because precinct polling places for partisan elections and elections held concurrently with partisan elections are funded by county governments.

The bill will save county governments approximately \$100,000 annually in general election years. Additional savings will be realized by counties conducting special elections to fill vacancies in partisan offices. The additional savings for special elections cannot be determined because the number of special elections cannot be accurately predicted.
