1 Section 1. Section 272.9A, Code 1997, is amended to read 2 as follows:

3 272.9A ADMINISTRATIVE LICENSES.

The board of educational examiners shall adopt rules 4 5 relating to professional development programs for individuals 5 licensed er-certificated as administrators of schools after 7 July-17-1985. Successful completion of a professional 8 development program is required every five years before the 9 license is cenewed by the board. In addition, the board shall 10 adopt rules specifying that an administrator employed by a 11 school district shall certify to the board that the 12 administrator has taught in a classroom for a period of not 13 less than two weeks every two years prior to the issuance of a 14 license or the renewal of a license under this chapter. 15 EXPLANATION 16 This bill requires the state board of educational examiners 17 to adopt rules specifying that public school administrators 18 must teach in a classroom for at least two weeks every two 19 years before the board will issue an administrative license or 20 renewal. 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35
