A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to distinguishing numbers assigned to driver's
2 licenses and persons with disabilities parking permits, and
3 providing for the Act's applicability.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 321.182, subsection 1, Code 1997, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 1. Make application on a form provided by the department
4 which shall include the applicant's full name, signature,
5 current mailing address, current residential address, date of
6 birth, ~~social-security-number~~, and physical description
7 including sex, height, and eye color. The application may
8 contain other information the department may require by rule,
9 except that an applicant's social security number shall not be
10 required to be included on the form unless the applicant is
11 applying for a commercial driver's license.

12 Sec. 2. Section 321.189, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code
13 Supplement 1997, is amended to read as follows:

14 a. Appearing on the driver's license shall be a
15 distinguishing number assigned to the licensee, which shall
16 not be the licensee's social security number except as
17 provided in paragraph "b"; the licensee's full name, date of
18 birth, sex, and residence address; a colored photograph; a
19 physical description of the licensee; the name of the state;
20 the dates of issuance and expiration; and the usual signature
21 of the licensee. The license shall identify the class of
22 vehicle the licensee may operate and the applicable
23 endorsements and restrictions which the department shall
24 require by rule.

25 Sec. 3. Section 321.189, subsection 2, paragraph c, Code
26 Supplement 1997, is amended by striking the paragraph.

27 Sec. 4. Section 321L.2, subsection 1, paragraph a,
28 unnumbered paragraph 1, Code Supplement 1997, is amended to
29 read as follows:

30 A resident of the state with a disability desiring a
31 persons with disabilities parking permit shall apply to the
32 department upon an application form furnished by the
33 department providing the applicant's name, address, and date
34 of birth, and-social-security-number and shall also provide a
35 statement from a physician licensed under chapter 148, 149,

1 150, or 150A, a physician assistant licensed under chapter
2 148C, an advanced registered nurse practitioner licensed under
3 chapter 152, or a chiropractor licensed under chapter 151, or
4 a physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or
5 chiropractor licensed to practice in a contiguous state,
6 written on the physician's, physician assistant's, nurse
7 practitioner's, or chiropractor's stationery, stating the
8 nature of the applicant's disability and such additional
9 information as required by rules adopted by the department
10 under section 321L.8. If the person is applying for a
11 temporary persons with disabilities parking permit, the
12 physician's, physician assistant's, nurse practitioner's, or
13 chiropractor's statement shall state the period of time during
14 which the person is expected to be disabled and the period of
15 time for which the permit should be issued, not to exceed six
16 months.

17 Sec. 5. APPLICABILITY. The state department of
18 transportation may continue to use a social security number on
19 a license or persons with disabilities parking permit only
20 until the license or permit is renewed on or after the
21 effective date of this Act. This section does not apply to
22 commercial driver's licenses.

23 EXPLANATION

24 This bill prohibits the state department of transportation
25 from using social security numbers as the distinguishing
26 number appearing on driver's licenses and persons with
27 disabilities parking permits. The prohibition does not apply
28 to commercial driver's licenses. Social security numbers
29 would need to be deleted from such licenses and permits upon
30 renewal on or after the effective date of the bill.

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
