Sec. 2. Section 321.189 , subsection 2, paragraph a, Code Supplement 1997, is amended to read as follows:
a. Appearing on the driver's license shall be a distinguishing number assigned to the licensee, which shall not bethe ! incense's social security number except as provided in paragraph "b"; the licensee's full name, date of birth; sex, and residence address; a colored photograph; a physical description of the licensee; the name of the state; the dates of issuance and expiration; and che usual signature of the license. The license shall identify the class of vehicle the :icensee may operate and the applicable endorsements and restrictions which the department shall require by rule.

Sec. 3. Section 321.189, subsection 2; paragraph c, Code Supplement 1997, is amended by striking the paragraph.

Sec. 4. Section 32lu. 2, subsection i, paragraph a, unnumbered paragraph 1 , Code Supplement 1997 , is amended to read as follows:

A resident of the state with a disability desiring a

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150, or 150A, a physician assistant licensed under chapter 148C, an advanced registered nurse practitioner licensed under chapter 152 , or a chiropractor licensed under chapter 151 , or a physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or chiropractor licensed to practice in a contiguous state, written on the physician's, physician assistant's, nurse practitioner's, or chiropractor's stationery, stating the nature of the applicant's disability and such additional information as required by rules adopted by the department under section 32lL.8. If the person is applying for a temporary persons with disabilities parking permit, the physician's, physician assistant's, nurse practitioner's, or chiropractor's statement shall state the period of time during which the person is expected to be disabled and the period of time for which the permit should be issued, not to exceed six months.

Sec. 5. APPLICABILITY. The state department of transportation may continue to use a social security number on a license or persons with disabilities parking permit only until the license or permit is renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. This section does not apply to commercial driver's licenses.

## EXPLANATION

This bill prohibits the state department of transportation from using social security numbers as the distinguishing number appearing on driver's licenses and persons with disabilities parking permits. The prohibition does not appiy to commercial driver's licenses. Social security numbers would need to be deleted from such licenses and permits upon renewal on or after the effective date of the bill.
